SUFFOLK COUNTY COUNCIL

Suffolk County Council (Parish of Risby) (C629 Road) (Restriction of Waiting) (Experimental) Order 198

Notice is hereby given that Suffolk County Council propose to make an Order under section 9 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m., Monday to Saturday inclusive on the sides and length of road described in the Schedule to this notice.

The proposals are to operate experimentally for an initial period of 6 months.

Exceptions in the Order provide for a vehicle to wait for as long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight, to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded, to enable it to be used in connection with any building or demolition operation and the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

A copy of the draft Order and a map showing the road affected, together with a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order are available for inspection during normal office hours at the offices of the Borough Secretary, St Edmundsbury Borough Council, Thingoe House, Northgate Street, Bury St Edmunds, and my office.

Objections to the Order, specifying the grounds on which they are made must be in writing and must reach me not later than 6th September 1982.

North side, from 10 metres east of the junction with the north/south section of the C629, westwards for 180 metres.

C629 Road (North/South Section), both sides, from the junction with the east/west section of the C629, northwards for 16 metres.

WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of West Sussex (Crawley: Kilnmead and adjoining Roads) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of West Sussex propose to make an Order under the provisions of section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be:

(1) To prohibit vehicles from waiting in lengths of the following roads in Crawley:

Applefield, Exchange Road, Kilnmead, Kilnmead Close, Kilnmead Cul-de-Sac (between Nos. 12 and 14 Kilnmead), Woodfield Road and Woolborough Road.

(2) To prohibit vehicles from waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 7 p.m. in lengths of Kilnmead, Crawley.

Limited exceptions are provided for in the draft Order for such vehicles as invalid carriages and disabled person's vehicles. Please study the draft Order for particulars.

WEST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

The County Council of West Sussex (Haywards Heath: Various Roads) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting, One-Way Traffic and Prohibition of Cycling) Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that on 11th August 1982 the West Sussex County Council made an Order under the provisions of sections 1 and 84D (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is:

(1) To prohibit vehicles from waiting at any time in lengths of the following roads in Haywards Heath:—

Boltro Road, Burrell Road, Church Road, Harlands Road, Hazelgrove Road, Heath Road, New England Road, Oaklands Road, Oathall Road (B.2112), Paddockhall Road, Pasture Hill Road, Penland Road, Perrymount Road (B.2028), Turners Mill Road and Wychperry Road.

(2) To prohibit vehicles from waiting between 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in lengths of the following roads in Haywards Heath:—

Church Road, Harlands Road, Highland Road, Lowfield Road, Lucastes Avenue, New England Road, Oathall Avenue, Pasture Hill Road and Turners Mill Road.

(3) To prohibit vehicles from proceeding in a direction other than that specified in relation to that length of road:

Lengths of Road	Direction
<i>Paddockhall Road</i>	
(i) from a point 43 metres south of the southern kerb-line of Milton Road, northwards on the western leg to the Milton Road Circulatory System.	Northwards
(ii) from the southern kerb-line of Milton Road Circulatory System southwards on the eastern leg for a distance of 43 metres.	Southwards
(iii) from the western kerb-line of the eastern leg of Paddockhall Road, westwards to the eastern kerb-line of the western leg of Paddockhall Road, opposite to Winnals Park.	Westwards

(4) To prohibit any person from riding any cycle in the following lengths of footpaths in Haywards Heath:

(i) Footpath between Edward Road and Sandy Vale, for its entire length.

(ii) Footpath between Oakwood Road and Wealdon Way, for its entire length.

Limited exceptions are provided for in the Order for such vehicles as invalid carriages and disabled persons' vehicles. Please study Order for particulars.

A copy of the Order which will come into operation on 18th August 1982, together with a plan showing the affected lengths of roads, may be inspected at the County Hall, Chichester, during normal office hours.

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within six weeks from 11th August 1982, apply to the High Court for this purpose.
