If any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question its validity, or the validity of any provision contained in it, on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulations made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, he or she may, within 6 weeks from 16th August 1982, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained in it.

Unless the Order is suspended or quashed as a consequence of any such application, any person who on 29th July 1982 has an interest in land having lawful access to a highway to which the Order relates may claim to be entitled to be compensated by the Wokingham District Council in respect of any depreciation in the value of his or her interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable. Any claim must be served on the council at its above address within a period of 6 months from 29th July 1982 unless the period is extended in any particular case by the Secretary of State.

IMPORTATION OF ANIMAL PRODUCTS AND POULTRY PRODUCTS ORDER 1980 (AS AMENDED)

Notice is hereby given that as provided by Article 4 of the Importation of Animal Products and Poultry Products Order 1980, as amended, the Ministry of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food and the Welsh Office Agriculture Fisheries and Food and the Welsh Office Agriculture Department have with effect from 20th July 1982 issued the following General Licences for Luxembourg.

Licence No. TAY/GEN/82/937 (In England) and WOAD/GEN/82/72 (In Wales)

Country: Luxembourg

Subject of Licence: Meat Products (including fully cured pigmeat and dry sausage (including Salami) and poultry meat products but excluding separate cuts or pieces of pig fat.

The Licence is valid for importation through:

- (a) all ports and airports in England and
- (b) all ports and airports in Wales.

Conditions attached to licence above.

A. Each consignment must be accompanied by a certificate in accordance with the terms of the Council Directive on health problems affecting intra-Community trade in meat products 77/79 EEC signed by an official veterinarian of the Government of Denmark.

B. Any meat product imported under the licence shall be made available if so required for inspection by an Officer of the Ministry at any place nominated by him for such inspection. The importer or his agent shall afford all assistance necessary to such an officer to enable him to carry out the inspection in such a manner as he shall determine and the importer shall be responsible for meeting any costs of carrying out such an inspection.

NOTE. This licence will not be invalidated by transit of the goods through any other country provided that if the goods are examined by Customs en route the vehicle is resealed and the documents are endorsed accordingly.

Whereas Section 12 (2) of the Finance Act 1899 provides that Her Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue may substitute, as respects any foreign or colonial currency mentioned in the Schedule to that Act, any rate of exchange for that specified in the Schedule and may add to the Schedule the rate of exchange for any foreign or colonial currency not mentioned therein, and that such Act shall be construed as if any rate of exchange for the time being substituted or added were contained in the said Schedule, and in the case of the substitution of the rate of exchange as if the rate for which the new rate is substituted were omitted from that Schedule; and whereas by notices duly advertised pursuant to the said Section the said Commissioners have from time to time, and lastly by notice duly advertised in the month of September 1981, substituted certain rates of exchange for those contained in the Schedule, and have added thereto certain rates of exchange. Now, therefore, the said Commissioners do hereby give notice that they substitute the following rates of exchange, based mainly on market rates which have been rounded, for those contained in the Schedule to the Finance Act 1899, as varied by the above-mentioned notices:
