#### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 209 of the above Act to authorise the stopping up of a part of Kings Meadow Road at Reading in the county of Berkshire to enable residential and office development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to English Property Corporation Limited by Reading Borough Council under Part III of the said Act.

### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 209 of the above Act entitled "The Stopping Up of Highways (County of Kent) (No 7) Order 1982", authorising the stopping up of two short lengths of Lords Wood Lane at Chatham in the County of Kent to enable residential development to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted under the Act.

**THE M5 MOTORWAY (POLTIMORE TO SANDY  
GATE SECTION AND CONNECTING ROADS)  
VARIATION SCHEME 198**

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he proposes to make a Scheme under section 16 of the Highways Act 1980 authorising him to vary paragraph 1 of Schedule 2 to the M5 Motorway (Poltimore to Sandy Gate Section) and Connecting Roads Scheme 1972 as follows:—

- (a) for the expression "Five routes" substitute the expression "Two routes" and  
 (b) for the expression "reference letters A, B, C, D and F" substitute the expression "reference letters B and C".

The above mentioned proposals are designed to remove the Secretary of State's authority to construct certain connecting roads to the motorway. The 1972 Scheme authorised the Secretary of State to construct five roads connecting the motorway with the London-Penzance Trunk Road A30 near Sowton Lodge, but only two have been constructed and it is not intended to proceed with the other three.

Copies of the draft Scheme, sketch plan and of the 1972 Scheme may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours from 18 August 1982 until 15 October 1982 or within eight weeks from the date of publication of this notice, whichever period shall expire later, at the Department of Transport, 2 Marsham Street, London SW1 and at the offices of the Department of Transport, South West Region, Victoria House, 26b Fore Street, Taunton, Somerset and Government Buildings, Alington Road, Exeter, and of Devon County Council, County Hall, Exeter and East Devon District Council, Council Offices, Knowle, Sidmouth, Devon.

Any person may not later than 15 October 1982 or within eight weeks from the date of publication of this notice, if such periods shall expire later, object to the making of the Scheme by notice to the Secretary of State at his address at the Department of Transport, South West Regional Office, Victoria House, 26b Fore Street, Taunton, Somerset, TA1 1JG, quoting reference CSW 405/303/26/07 and stating the grounds of objection. In the preparation of an objection and the statement of grounds of objection it should be borne in mind that the substance of any objection or representation may be communicated to other people who may be affected by it.

Whereas Section 12 (2) of the Finance Act 1899 provides that Her Majesty's Commissioners of Inland Revenue may substitute, as respects any foreign or colonial currency mentioned in the Schedule to that Act, any rate of exchange for that specified in the Schedule and may add to the Schedule the rate of exchange for any foreign or colonial currency not mentioned therein, and that such Act shall be construed as if any rate of exchange for the time being substituted or added were contained in the said Schedule, and in the case of the substitution of the rate of exchange as if the rate for which the new rate is substituted were omitted from that Schedule; and whereas by notices duly advertised pursuant to the said Section the said Commissioners have from time to time, and lastly by notice duly advertised in the month of September 1981, substituted certain rates of exchange for those contained in the Schedule, and have added thereto certain rates of exchange.
