The Sandwell Borough Council (John Street and Payne Street, Blackheath) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1982

SANDWELL METROPOLITAN BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Sandwell Borough Council (Hall Street South, Houghton Street and Union Street, West Bromwich) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1982

SUNDERLAND BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Sunderland (Roker Baths Road) (Restriction of Waiting) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Sunderland pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 with the Tyne and Wear County Council in exercise of powers conferred by section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 (as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 Schedule 19 of the Local Government Act 1972 and Schedule 6 of the Road Traffic Act 1974) and of all other enabling powers propose to make an Order the effect of which will be to provide that no person shall, except upon the direction or with the permission of a Police Constable in uniform or a Traffic Warden, cause or permit any vehicle to wait at any time in the lengths of Roker Baths Road referred to in the Schedule hereto.

- the supply of gas, water or electricity.
