B. Any meat imported under this licence shall be made available if so required for inspection by an Officer of the Ministry at any place nominated by him for such inspec-tion. The importer or his agent shall afford all assistance necessary to such an officer to enable him to carry out the inspection in such manner as he shall determine and the importer shall be responsible for meeting any costs of carrying out such an inspection carrying out such an inspection.
