The Proposed East Staffordshire District Council (Duke Street, Milton Street and Cross Street, Burton-upon-Trent) (One-Way Traffic) (Amendment) Order 1982.

The effect of the Order will be to amend the County Borough of Burton-upon-Trent (Duke Street, Cross Street and Milton Street) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1969 by reversing the direction of the one-way traffic system in Cross Street and Milton Street as follows:

Existing System

Cross Street:

rom its junction with Station Street to its junction with Duke From its Street from north-east to south-west.

Proposed System

From its junction with Duke Street to its junction with Station Street from southwest to north-east.

Milton Street:

From its junction Duke Street to its junction with Station Street from south-west to north-east.

From its junction Station Street to its junc-tion with Duke Street from north-east to southwest.

The one-way traffic system in Duke Street (from its junction with Union Street to its junction with Russell Street) will remain unaltered, i.e. from south-east to north-west.

Full details of the proposals are in the draft Order which together with a map showing the areas affected and a statement of the Council's reasons for making the Order, may be examined at the Town Hall, Burton-upon-Trent, from Monday to Friday between the hours of 9 a.m. and p.m.
