

## COVENTRY CITY COUNCIL

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

*Designation of Conservation Area*

Notice is hereby given that Coventry City Council, as local planning authority under the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, have designated an area in the City as a "Conservation Area" under section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, to be known as "High Street Conservation Area".

The objects of such designation are to preserve the character or appearance of an area of special architectural or historic interest, to control developments in the area and to encourage measures to improve the environment.

Within the designated area the consent of the City Council, as local planning authority, must be obtained before any building is demolished or partially demolished. It is also necessary to give the Council six weeks notice, in writing, before any tree in the designated area is cut down, uprooted, topped, lopped, wilfully destroyed or damaged. In both cases limited works are permitted, but information on this should be obtained from the Department of Architecture and Planning, Tower Block, Much Park Street, Coventry, before proceeding.

High Street Conservation Area includes properties in parts of High Street, Little Park Street, Greyfriars Lane, Hertford Street and Salt Lane. A plan and detailed description of the Area are available for public inspection during normal office hours at the Department of Architecture and Planning, Tower Block, Much Park Street, Coventry.

## NOTICE OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

## TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971, SECTION 210

*The Borough of Thamesdown (Footpath No. 51 Lydiard Tregoze) Public Path Diversion Order 1982*

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 29th September 1982 is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by Thamesdown Borough Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public Right of Way running for approximately 260 metres from a point on a footpath abutting that part of Wootton Bassett Road which has been closed and now realigned near Mannington Roundabout, Swindon south of its junction with the C28 as shown marked "A" on the map annexed to the Order in a southerly direction to a point marked "B" on the map to a line running from the said point marked "A" on the map along the said Wootton Bassett Road in an east south easterly direction to a point marked "C" on the map for approximately 70 metres crossing the new A420 then running in a generally southerly direction for approximately 220 metres to the point marked "B" on the map.

A copy of this Order and of the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Legal Department, Civic Offices, Euclid Street, Swindon between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays.

Any representation or objections with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Borough Solicitor, Thamesdown Borough Council, Civic Offices, Euclid Street, Swindon not later than 13th November 1982 and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn Thamesdown Borough Council may, instead of submitting the Order to The Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted to The Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.

If you wish to be notified if the Order is confirmed, and to have a copy of the Order as confirmed, you should write to the Borough Solicitor, Thamesdown Borough Council at the address given above giving your name and address to which these documents may be sent.

*Notice of Public Path Order Highways Act 1980—Gwent County Council (Monmouth District—Community of Caldicot—Footpath No. 15) Public Path Diversion Order 1982*

Notice is hereby given that the above named order (hereinafter referred to as "the order") made on 6th October 1982, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for Wales for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Gwent County Council as an unopposed order.

The effect of the order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert the public right of way F.P. No. 15 running across land in Caldicot Community in Monmouth District and more particularly described in the Schedule hereto.

If the order is submitted to the Secretary of State for confirmation any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the order.

## PART I

*Description of Site of Existing Public Footpath*

The length of Public Footpath No. 15 in Caldicot Community to be diverted commences at a point South of Chepstow Road, Caldicot and South West of Ye Old Tipling Philosopher Public House and proceeds in a Southerly and South
