

KENSINGTON AND CHELSEA ROYAL BOROUGH COUNCIL

PROPOSED DOCTOR PARKING PLACES

The Kensington and Chelsea (Doctor Parking Places) (No.) Order 198

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea are applying to the Greater London Council for an Order under sections 35, 36, 37, 40 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968 to be entitled the Kensington and Chelsea (Doctor Parking Places) (No.) Order 198.

The general effect of The Kensington and Chelsea (Doctor Parking Places) (No.) Order 198 would be in The Royal Borough of Kensington and Chelsea to designate doctor parking places in Redcliffe Gardens and Sloane Avenue at which only vehicles authorised by the Order could be left. These parking spaces would be reserved for the leaving of vehicles by a specified doctor who needs special parking arrangements near his surgery or consulting room and each would be in operation between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. daily throughout the year. The charge for the use of these parking places would be £60 per annum.

The restrictions imposed by The Kensington and Chelsea (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 on the waiting by vehicles will no longer apply in the proposed new parking places.

A copy of the proposed Order, of The Kensington and Chelsea (Doctor Parking Places) (No. 1) Order 1975 and Orders which have amended that Order, of the maps which indicate each length of the highways to which the proposed Order relates, of The Kensington and Chelsea (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976 (and of the Orders which have amended that Order) and of the Council's statement of reasons for applying for the proposed Order, can be inspected until 8th November 1982, during normal office hours, Mondays to Fridays at the Parking Control Office, The Town Hall, Hornton Street, London W.8, The Information Office, Children's Library, Hornton Street, London W.8, and the Information Office, Chelsea Old Town Hall, Kings Road, London S.W.3.

The Kent County Council (Footpath at Bishops Close, Nettlestead) (Prohibition of Cycling) Order

KENT COUNTY COUNCIL

The Kent County Council (Various Roads, Newington) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the Kent County Council proposes to make an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the

effect of which would be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at all times on the north side of High Street, A2, Newington, from the east flank wall of No. 57 High Street (The Inglenook Restaurant), to a point 25 metres west of the centre of Church Lane.

Exceptions would be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait with police permission or for passengers to board or alight, for the loading or unloading of goods, for enabling work to be carried out in or adjacent to the road, for disabled persons and for emergency service vehicles.

A copy of the proposed Order, an explanatory statement and a map showing the length of road concerned may be inspected during normal office hours at Room 1.97, County Hall, Maidstone, or at the offices of the Swale Borough Council, Council Offices, Central Avenue, Sittingbourne.

KENT COUNTY COUNCIL

The Kent County Council (Various Roads, Aylesford) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1982

The Kent County Council (Mount Pleasant, Aylesford) (One Way) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that on 14th October 1982, the Kent County Council made Orders under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is to:

- (a) prohibit the waiting of vehicles at all times in Vicarage Close, Aylesford for its entire length;
- (b) prohibit the driving of vehicles other than in a south-westerly direction in Mount Pleasant, Aylesford from 33 metres west of its junction with Rochester Road to its junction with The Square.

In relation to (a) above, exceptions are provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait with police permission or for passengers to board or alight, for the loading or unloading of goods, for enabling works to be carried out in or adjacent to the road, for disabled persons and for emergency service vehicles.

A copy of the Orders, which will come into operation on 20th October 1982, and a map showing the roads concerned may be inspected during normal office hours at Room 1.97, County Hall, Maidstone.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

The Leicestershire County Council (Rolleston Road and Galby Road, Billesdon) (30 m.p.h. Speed Limit) Order 198 .
