Leicestershire County Council (Various Streets, Ashby-de-la-Zouch) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the Leicestershire County Council proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time in the length of road and on the sides of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

The Order will contain provisions for the usual exemptions to permit waiting by any disabled persons vehicle and for the purposes of:

- (i) picking up and setting down passengers,
- (ii) loading and unloading goods,
- (iii) enabling a vehicle to be used in connection with a wedding or funeral; and where necessary in connection with:
- (iv) the maintenance of the roads; and
- (v) the supply of gas, electricity and water.

Full details are contained in the draft Order, which, together with a map showing the restricted roads and a statement of the council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined during normal office hours at my offices, Room 210, County Hall, Glenfield, Leicestershire, and at the offices of North West Leicestershire District Council, Council Offices, Coalville, Leicestershire.

If you wish to object to the proposal, you should send the grounds for your objection in writing to the undersigned by 28 days from the date of publication of this notice.

The Leicestershire County Council (Glen Road, Newton Harcourt and Newton Lane, Great Glen) (Prohibition of Commercial Vehicles over 7.5 tonnes) Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that the Leicestershire County Council has made an Order under section 1 (1), (2) (3), (3AA) and (6) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which will be to prohibit any heavy commercial vehicle, the maximum gross weight of which exceeds 7.5 tonnes, from proceeding along any part of that road known as Glen Road, Newton Harcourt, and Newton Lane, Great Glen.

The Order will contain exemptions for the purposes of:

- (a) Conveying goods to or from premises.
- (b) Agriculture in connection with land adjoining the road.
- (c) Building or demolition operations.
- (d) Road, sewer, or mains maintenance, improvement or repair.
- (e) Emergency services.
- (f) Surfacing, garaging or repairing a vehicle.
- (g) Holding a fair, circus or similar event which has been authorised by the Council.
