The Derbyshire County Council (Public Footpath No. 102, Parish of Glossop) (Public Path Diversion) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 14th October 1982, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the Derbyshire County Council as an unopposed Order.

NOTICE OF CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

Leicestershire County Council (Footpath K.15 (Part) Loughborough) Public Path Diversion Order 1980

Notice is hereby given that the Leicestershire County Council has confirmed the above-named Order. The effect of the Order as confirmed, is to divert that part of Footpath K.15 at Loughborough from a point 22 metres south-west of the southern end of Grasmere Road, Shelthorpe, in a generally south-south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 268 metres. The alternative route is on land to the west of the part of the footpath which has been diverted.
