**ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967,  
SECTION 12 (1)**

*The Trunk Road (A428) (St. Loyes Street/Dame Alice Street, Bedford) (Temporary Prohibition of Traffic) Order 1982.*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Transport has made an Order on the Felixstowe to Weedon Trunk Road (A428) at Bedford.

The Order, which has been made to enable works to be carried out, will be in operation, when the appropriate signs are erected, from 23rd October 1982 until such time as the works have been completed.

The effect of the Order will be to close those lengths of the trunk road known as St. Loyes Street and Dame Alice Street which extend from Hassett Street to Harpur Street.

Access to Allhallows, St. Loyes Street, Lime Street and Harpur Street (central section) will be maintained from Dame Alice Street only.

Eastbound traffic on the trunk road will be diverted via Union Street and Tavistock Street and will rejoin the trunk road at The Broadway.

Westbound traffic on the trunk road will be diverted via Harpur Street, Tavistock Street and Union Street and will rejoin the trunk road at the junction of Union Street with Bromham Road.

The closure of the trunk road will only take place between 6 p.m. on a Saturday evening and midnight on the following Sunday.

**LAND DRAINAGE ACT 1976**

*Ashfields and West Moor Internal Drainage District*

Notice is hereby given that the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food, in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by sections 11 (4) and 109 (6) of the Land Drainage Act 1976, has now made an Order confirming, with a modification, a Scheme submitted to him by the Severn-Trent Water Authority under section 11 (1) of the Land Drainage Act 1976, making provision for:

- (i) the abolition of the Ashfields and the West Moor Internal Drainage Boards;

- (ii) the amalgamation of the existing Drainage Districts thereof;
- (iii) the constitution of a new Internal Drainage Board;
- (iv) matters supplemental thereto or consequential thereon.

The Order will become final and have effect as an Act of Parliament unless during the period of 30 days after the date of publication of this notice a memorial is presented to the Minister by some person or body affected and having an interest sufficient for presentation of a memorial (as prescribed in Article 6 of the Land Drainage (River Authorities) General Regulations 1965 (S.I. 1965/443) as applied to Water Authorities by section 9 of the Water Act 1973) praying that the Order shall be subject to special Parliamentary procedure.
