

## ELMBRIDGE BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The Borough of Elmbriidge (Waiting and Loading) (Restriction) Amendment Order 1982*

Notice is hereby given that on 13th October 1982, the Elmbriidge Borough Council made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, further amending the Esher (Waiting and Loading) (Restriction) Order 1967, as previously amended, and affecting Portsmouth Road and St. Leonard's Road, Thames Ditton.

When this Order comes into operation no one will be permitted to leave a vehicle:

(a) *At any time in:*

- (i) *Portsmouth Road*, Thames Ditton, the north-west side, from the centre line of its junction with St. Leonard's Road, south-westwards for a distance of 90 metres (295 feet).
- (ii) *St. Leonard's Road*, Thames Ditton, the southern side, from its junction with Portsmouth Road, westwards for a distance of 45 metres (148 feet).

(b) *Between 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m., on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in:*

- St. Leonard's Road*, Thames Ditton, the northern side, from its junction with Portsmouth Road, westwards for a distance of 45 metres (148 feet).

The additional restrictions will be subject to the various exceptions contained in the Order of 1967.

The Order will come into operation on Wednesday, 10th November 1982. A copy of the Order and a map showing the restricted roads may be examined at:

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provisions contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of that Act or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 13th October 1982, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

## MID GLAMORGAN COUNTY COUNCIL

*Mid Glamorgan County Council (Bronllynwyr (Part) Pentyrch) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1982*

Notice is hereby given that on 12th October 1982, the Mid Glamorgan County Council made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time on both sides of Bronllynwyr Pentyrch from the south-western side of its junction with High Corner, south-westwards for a distance of 20 metres (22 yards).

Exemptions are provided in the Order for the purposes of boarding, alighting, loading and unloading, building and roadworks, the maintenance of essential services, weddings, funerals and the delivery or collection of postal packets by vehicles in the service of the Post Office. Disabled persons' vehicles displaying the relevant disabled person's badge will be allowed to wait for up to 2 hours with return prohibited within 1 hour.

The Order came into operation on 22nd October 1982, and a copy thereof and a map showing the length of road to which the Order relates may be inspected at the offices of the Mid Glamorgan County Council, Cathays Park, Cardiff, during normal office hours until the end of 6 weeks from 22nd October 1982.

Any person wishing to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act as so amended or of any Instrument made under it has not been complied

with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks from 22nd October 1982, apply to the High Court for this purpose.

*Sides of lengths of roads in the Borough of Taff Ely*

(i) *Cae Fardre*, Church Village, both sides, north-eastwards from its junction with St. Illtyds Road, for a distance of 20 metres (22 yards).

(ii) *St. Illtyds Road*, Church Village, on the north-eastern side, from the north-western side of its junction with *Cae Fardre* north-westwards to the southern boundary of No. 14 *St. Illtyds Road*, a distance of approximately 67 metres (73 yards).

(iii) *St. Illtyds Road*, Church Village, on the north-eastern side, from the south-eastern side of its junction with *Cae Fardre* south-eastwards for a distance of approximately 10 metres (11 yards).
