NORTHUMBERLAND COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Cumberland (Market Place, Bedlington) (Waiting Restriction) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Northumberland propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended.

The effect of the Order, if made, will be to prohibit waiting at any time on the north side of West End Front Street, Bedlington, from the junction with Vulcan Place, westwards to a point opposite the eastern boundary wall of the Howard Arms, a distance of approximately 55 metres.

Exemptions will be included in the Order to allow access to premises and for certain other necessary purposes.

ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The Greater Manchester County (Vulcan Street Area, Oldham) Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting (Extension No. 2) (Borough) Order 1982.

The Greater Manchester County (Wildmoor Avenue, Covert Road, Oldham) Restriction of Waiting (Borough) Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that the Oldham Borough Council, acting pursuant to arrangements made under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972, with the Greater Manchester County Council, have today made Orders under sections 1 (1), (2), (3) and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is to (i) extend the Greater Manchester County (Vulcan Street Area Oldham) Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting (Borough) Order 1980 by prohibiting waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Mondays to Fridays, in the length of road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice and (ii) prohibit waiting between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m., Mondays to Fridays, in the lengths of roads specified in Schedule 2.

The Orders will come into operation on 25th October 1982.

Exemptions

- (a) to enable persons to board or alight from a vehicle;
- (b) to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from a vehicle;
- (c) vehicles used for building or demolition operations, funerals, weddings, roadworks, works on sewers or statutory undertakers equipment;

(d) vehicles used in pursuance of statutory powers and duties;

(e) disabled persons' vehicles for up to 2 hours, return prohibited within 1 hour.
