The Sedgemoor District Council (Footpath No. BW28/15 at Puriton) Public Path Diversion Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that on 19th October 1982 the Sedgemoor District Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert the public right of way running from a point on Station Road, Dunball, which point is approximately 85 metres east of its junction with Bristol Road, in an easterly direction for a total distance of 216 metres to run from the same above-mentioned commencing point in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 37 metres, then eastwards for a distance of approximately 175 metres and then north-eastwards for a distance of approximately 28 metres to re-connect with the remainder of Footpath No. BW28/15.

The City of Southampton (Lord's Hill District Centre) (Public Path Diversion) (Amendment) Order 1982

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 20th October 1982, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by Southampton City Council as an unopposed Order. The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, is to amend the City of Southampton (Lord's Hill District Centre) Public Path Diversion Order 1982 which diverted the public right of way which ran from the subway under the road known as Lord's Hill Centre East to another footpath at the northern corner of Lord's Hill Health Centre, by the deletion of that part of one of the alternative routes which forms the arcade adjacent to the "Homebase" unit at Lord's Hill District Centre. It is intended that this arcade will become a walkway. The

remaining alternative route is via the footpath adjacent to the Health Centre and along the footway adjacent to the carriageway of Lord's Hill Centre East.

Copies of the Order, the map contained in it and the original Order have been deposited at the City Secretary's Office in the Civic Centre and they may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable times.

Any representation or objection in respect of the Order should be sent in writing to Southampton City Council's City Secretary and Solicitor at the Civic Centre, Southampton SO9 4XR, not later than 25th November 1982, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the Southampton City Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation, themselves confirm the Order as an unopposed Order. If the Order is submitted, to the Secretary of State for confirmation, any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be sent to the Secretary of State with the Order.
