HIGHWAYS ACT 1980

The South Northamptonshire District Council (Parish of Farthinghoe, Footpath AM.35) Public Path Diversion Order 1982.

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Order (hereinafter referred to as "the Order") made on 12th October 1982, is about to be submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment for confirmation or to be confirmed by the South Northamptonshire District Council as an unopposed Order.

The effect of the Order, if confirmed without modification, will be to divert:

- (1) Footpath AM.35 starting from a point at grid Ref. SP 5372 3973 adjoining the garden of No. 11 Bowling Green at the southern end of the cul-de-sac known as Bowling Green and running in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 16 metres alongside the former south-eastern boundary of No. 11 Bowling Green, to a point at grid Ref. SP 5371 3973 adjacent to the entrance to the former village hall; and
- (2) a length of footpath starting from a point at grid Ref. SP 5371 3973 adjacent to the entrance to the former village hall and running in a south-south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 9 metres to a point at grid Ref. SP 5370 3971 adjoining the A422 road; to a line starting from a point at grid Ref. SP 5373 3971 adjoining the front garden of No. 10 Bowling Green at the termination of an existing footpath and running in a generally south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 18 metres to a point at grid Ref. SP 5371 3969 adjoining the A422 road and 17 metres south-east of the existing point of termination of the footpath.

A copy of the Order and the map contained in it has been deposited and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Brackley Road, Towcester, during normal office hours from Mondays to Fridays. Any representation or objection with respect to the Order may be sent in writing to the Chief Administrative Officer, South Northamptonshire District Council, Council Offices, Brackley Road, Towcester, Northamptonshire, before 25th November 1982, and should state the grounds on which it is made.

If no representations or objections are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, the South Northamptonshire District Council may, instead of submitting the Order to the Secretary of State for the Environment, themselves confirm the Order. If the Order is submitted to the Secretary of State for the Environment any representations and objections which have been duly made and not withdrawn will be transmitted with the Order.
