

- (b) to prohibit waiting by vehicles from 8 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays in lengths of Town Street at Rodley;
- (c) to prohibit waiting of vehicles from 7.30 a.m. to 9 a.m. and from 4.30 p.m. to 6 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays in a length of Town Street at Rodley.

The proposal will contain the normal exemptions.

A copy of the draft Order and of a map showing the restricted roads and a statement of reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined during normal office hours at the Reception Desk, Main Entrance, County Hall, Wakefield; at the Leeds Traffic Unit, 5th Floor East, Merrion House, Merrion Way, Leeds, and at the Leeds City Council's Area Office, Council Offices, Manor Road, Horsforth.

### THE WEST YORKSHIRE METROPOLITAN COUNTY COUNCIL

*The West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council (Leeds) (Parking Places) (No. 2) Order 1976 (Amendment) Order 1981.*

Notice is hereby given that the West Yorkshire Metropolitan County Council have made the above Order under their powers in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, the effect of which is:

- (a) to increase the fixed charge for use of the West Street Car Park, Leeds, to 60 pence per day;
- (b) to provide for the payment of the charge on exit as at present; or on entry on a "pay and display" basis by purchasing a parking ticket from a machine or from a parking attendant. Only one method of payment will operate at any given moment in time but the proposal will give the County Council power to change the method of payment at its discretion.

###### TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

*The Metropolitan Borough of Bolton (Footpath 99 Westhoughton) Public Path Diversion Order 1982*

Notice is hereby given that on 18th October 1982, the Bolton Metropolitan Borough Council confirmed the above-named Order.

The effect of the Order, as confirmed, is to divert a length of the public right of way known as Footpath 99 Westhoughton which runs over land to the north of Manchester Road, Westhoughton.
