TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Registrar's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England on Friday, 5th November 1982, at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 8th November 1982 to Friday, 12th November 1982 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent: (being a multiple of one halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

8. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders. (24 SI)

NOTICE OF DISCLAIMER UNDER SECTION 355 OF THE COMPANIES ACT 1948

Whereas:

- (1) Pursuant to section 290 of the Companies Act 1948 Alexander Land Company Ltd (hereinafter called "the Company") became dissolved on 29th February 1968.
- (2) It is alleged that immediately before such dissolution the property disclaimed by this notice may have been

vested in the Company and may by virtue of section 354 of the Companies Act 1948 be deemed to have become bona vacantia and to have vested in the Crown.

(3) It is desired to disclaim the Crown's Title (if any) to the property

(4) That the property may have vested came to the notice of the Treasury Solicitor on 4th October 1982.

Now therefore I, the Treasury Solicitor, in exercise of the power in that behalf given by section 355 of the Companies Act 1948 do by this notice disclaim the Crown's title (if any) to the property described in the Schedule hereto.

CUSTOMS AND EXCISE

NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS AND EXCISE MANAGEMENT ACT 1979

Pursuant to section 139 (6) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 and paragraph 1 of the 3rd Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the customs and excise Acts and any enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, namely 400 Ladies Jackets of man-made fibre have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that:

1. the said goods were imported on 15th November 1981 at Coatbridge, Glasgow, contrary to the restriction for the time being in force with respect thereto under the Import of Goods (Control) Order 1954, as amended, made under section 1, Import, Export and Customs Powers (Defence) Act 1939;
2. the said goods being imported goods were found not to correspond with the description in Box 31 of the C10 entry thereof, dated 1st December 1981, namely ladies traditional silk woven jackets, in that they were of man-made fibres.

Whereby and by force of section 49 (1) (b) and (e) Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within one month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act specifying the name and address of a Solicitor in Scotland who is authorised to accept service of process and to act on your behalf. In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.
