*The Trunk Road (Great Cambridge Road, Cheshunt) (A10)  
(Direction of Traffic) Order 1982*

1. The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, on the London-Cambridge-King's Lynn Trunk Road (A10) at its junction with College Road, Cheshunt, in the Borough of Broxbourne, in the county of Hertfordshire.

2. The effect of the Order, which comes into operation on 29th November 1982, is to direct traffic movements at this junction as shown by the appropriate road markings and also revoke the existing right turn ban from the southbound carriage-way of the trunk road into College Road.
