- (e) a disabled person's vehicle which displays a disabled person's badge issued by any local authority in accordance with the provisions of the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1971 or a badge having effect under those Regulations as if it were a disabled person's badge.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL REGULATIONS 1976

The Secretary of State for Transport hereby gives notice that on the application of Wirral Borough Council he has made an Order entitled "The Conversion of Highways into Footpaths or Bridleways (County of Merseyside) (No. 1) Order 1982". The Order comes into operation on 7th January 1983, and extinguishes any right which persons may have to use vehicles (other than those specified in Schedule 2 to the Order) on lengths of Bridle Road and Corbyn Street, Wallasey.

Unless the Order is suspended or quashed as a consequence of any such application, any person who on 7th January 1983, has an interest in land having lawful access to a highway to which the Order relates may claim to be entitled to be compensated by the Wirral Borough Council in respect of any depreciation in the value of his or her interest which is directly attributable to the Order and of any other loss or damage which is so attributable. Any claim must be served on the Council at its above address within a period of 6 months from 7th January 1983 unless the period is extended in any particular case by the Secretary of State.
