PUBLIC SCHOOLS ACT 1868

The Governing Body of Westminster School having made a Statute in the terms appended hereto, the same is hereby published in the *London Gazette* as required by the above-named Act.

Any person or persons or body corporate authorised by the said Act may within two months after the publication hereof petition Her Majesty in Council to withhold Her approval from the whole or any part of the said Statute.

Statute made by the Governing Body of Westminster School on 1st February 1983.

We, the Governing Body of St. Peter's College, Westminster, commonly called Westminster School, in virtue of the powers invested in us by the Public Schools Act 1868 and of all other powers enabling us in that behalf do hereby make the following Statute amending the Statute sealed with our Common Seal the 17th May 1869, as subsequently amended.

STATUTE

1. This Statute shall take effect from and after the approval thereof by Her Majesty in Council.

2. The words "a Member of the Church of England and" shall be deleted from Clause 3 of the Statute sealed with our corporate seal on 17th May 1869 and approved by The Queen in Council on 7th October 1869 (as subsequently amended).

TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Registrar's Office (Bank Buildings) at the Bank of England on Friday, 11th February 1983 at 1 p.m., for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act 1877, and the National Loans Act 1968, to the amount of £100,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £100,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 14th February 1983, to Friday, 18th February 1983 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent (being a multiple of one halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Bank of England.

8. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserved the right of rejecting any Tenders.
