# TREASURY

RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS BY THE PUBLIC WORKS LOAN COMMISSIONERS TO LOCAL **AUTHORITIES** 

#### NOTICE

TREASURY MINUTE dated 23rd March 1983.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury read section 3(2) of the National Loans Act 1968 (1968 c. 13 as amended) whereby any sums borrowed from the Public Works
Loan Commissioners shall bear interest at such rates as the Treasury may determine from time to time in accordance with section 5 of the said Act.

My Lords understand that the Public Works Loan Commissioners will be operating arrangements under which local authorities are permitted to borrow from the Commissioners up to a specified quota at a certain fixed rate of interest and in excess of such quota at one of two higher fixed rates.

In accordance therewith the Chancellor of the Exchequer now recommends that with effect from 23rd March 1983 and until the coming into operation of a further determination:

- I. The rate of interest applicable to any such fixed rate loan will be that in force on the banking day preceding the date the principal is credited to the account of the authority's banker;
- II. Different rates of interest shall be charged on such fixed rate loans according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by instalments or at maturity and, if repaid by instalments, whether by equal instalments of the principal with interest paid on the decreasing balance of the principal (E.I.P.), or by instalments of equal repayments of the principal and interest paid thereon (E.R.);
- III. The rates of such interest shall be:

Subject to the provisions of section 9 of the Clean Air Act 1968 any person who acquires for use in a Smoke Control Area or who sells by retail for delivery in a Smoke Control Area any solid fuel other than an authorised fuel shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £100.

# THE POST OFFICE OVERSEAS PARCEL POST AMENDMENT (No. 1) SCHEME 1983

The Post Office, by virtue of the powers conferred upon it by Section 28 of the Post Office Act 1969, and of all other powers enabling it in this behalf, hereby makes the following Scheme:

Commencement and citation

- 1.—(1) This Scheme shall come into operation on 5th April 1983 and may be cited as the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1983.
- (2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Parcel Post Scheme 1982 (Scheme P3/1982) (hereinafter called "the Scheme").

**Prohibitions**

- 4. In sub-paragraph (3)(a) of paragraph 21 of the Scheme the amount "50p" shall be deleted and "60p" inserted in its place. Delivery free of charges
- 5. In sub-paragraph (1)(b) of paragraph 22 of the Scheme the amount "50p" shall be deleted and "60p" inserted in its place. Insured parcels and uninsured parcels containing valuables
  - 6. In sub-paragraph (1)(i) of paragraph 23 of the Scheme the second sentence shall be deleted and the following substituted: "At the request of the sender, the Post Office may furnish a duplicate of such certificate on payment of such charge as the Post Office may fix in the particular case."

- 7. In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 26 of the Scheme the amount "22½p" shall be deleted and "20p" inserted in its place.

#### Interpretation

4. In sub-paragraph (1) of paragraph 7 of the Scheme, the figure "12" shall read "10".

#### Unpaid or underpaid postage

- 5.—(1) In sub-paragraph (1)(a) of paragraph 13 of the Scheme, the words "an amount equal to twice the amount of the postage, or as the case may be, of the deficiency;" shall be deleted and the words "such amount as the Post Office may determine;" inserted in their place.
- (2) In sub-paragraph (1)(b) of paragraph 13 of the Scheme, the words "an amount equal to that sum, or as the case may be, to the amount of the deficiency." shall be deleted and the words "such amount as the Post Office may determine." inserted in their

- (2) In sub-paragraph (5) of paragraph 28 of the Scheme, the words "if the addressee refuses to pay the amount payable in respect of the deficiency, it shall be paid by the sender." shall be deleted and the words "there shall be payable by the addressee on the delivery of the packet, or, if the packet is refused or cannot for any other reason be delivered, by the sender, such amount as the Post Office may determine." inserted in their place.

# Redirection by the public

- (2) This Scheme shall be read as one with the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Scheme 1982 (Post Office Scheme P2/1982) (hereinafter called "the Scheme") as amended by the Post Office Overseas Letter Post Amendment (No. 1) Scheme 1982 (Post Office Scheme P6/1982).

that vehicle;

(f) any vehicle if the driver thereof is obliged to enter or proceed in the bus lane in order to avoid an accident and forthwith causes that vehicle to leave the bus lane

(g) any vehicle if the driver thereof is required by law to stop and as soon as reasonably practicable thereafter causes that vehicle to leave the bus lane.

- (B) suspend part of The London Traffic (Prescribed Routes) (St. Marylebone and St. Pancras) Regulations 1961, so as to permit stage carriages, scheduled express carriages, school buses or works buses and vehicles being used for ambulance, fire brigade and police purposes in an emergency to turn right from Great Portland Street into Marylebone Road;
- (C) apply in a modified form the provisions of the City of Westminster (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1976, so that
