(PROHIBITION OF WAITING) ORDER 1983

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales proposes to make an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended. The effect of

the proposed Order will be to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle at any time on any day on the length of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

Exceptions in the Order will permit waiting for the following purposes:

- (a) picking up or setting down passengers;
- (b) loading or unloading goods;
- (c) building, industrial or demolition operations and
- (d) carrying out essential services connected with the maintenance of the road and the supply of gas, water and electricity.

The usual exceptions have also been provided in the proposed Order for vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge.
