Rome, Nov. 21. N. S. Tho' it has been confidently faid, that the Pope intended to make a Fromotion of Cardinals, 'tis now believ'd that there will hardly be any till a Peace is concluded between the Parties contending for the Spanish Monarchy. The Election of the Baron de Schrotenback to the Bishoprick of Olmutz, having been disapprov'd by this Court, the Prince of Lorrain has still some Hopes of obtaining it. On Sunday the Duke de Sermonetta Gaetani proceeded on his Journey from Milan to Naples, having feveral Difpatches of Importance for the Viceroy of that Kingdom; and Yesterday came hither the Prince of Avellino, to refide here in Quality of Ambaffador from his Imperial Majesty. Tis discours'd here, that the Emperor has form'd some Pretensions to the City of Sienna, in the Territories of the Grand Duke of Tuscany; which is the reason of his having caus'd fix or feven thousand of his Troops to march into that Country. The Abbot de Livri is also arriv'd, in order to execute the Orfice of Auditor of the Rota, in the room of the Abbot de Polignac; and has been fince entertain'd with the Duke d'Atri, and Cardinal Aquaviva by the Cardinal de la Tremouille. Monsieur Molinez is gone to take Possession of the Archbishoprick of Saragossa, lately conterr'd upon him by the Duke of Anjou. There has been an Earthquake at Aquila in the Abruzzo, but without doing any Damage. They write from Venice, that two of their Ships, which were taken and carried into Marfeilles some time fince by the French Privateers, have been condemn'd as Prize, and they are felling off their Cargoes, which are valued at One Million five hundred thouland Crowns.

Dresden, Decemb. 4. N. S. It is uncertain whether King Augustus will come into these Parts this Winter, that Journey depending altogether upon the Success of his Affairs in Pomerania. Letters from Leopold of the Twenty-first past say, that the Crown-General had dispatch'd an Express to his Polish Majesty, with an Account of what had pass'd in the late Conferences held there about the Repartition of the Winter-Quarters of the Muscovites Troops. 'Tis reported, that the Czar has discharg'd several Officers from his Service, and likewise reform'd several Regiments; that the Town of Caminski, upon the Black Sea, has been deliver'd up to the Turks, the Fortifications of it having been first demolish'd; but, that Asoph will not be Surrender'd till the King of Sueden and Palatine of Kiow have quitted the Turkish Dominions. They talk as if that General was to return into Poland very speedily, in order to undertake some Enterprize against the consederated Nobility of the Party of King Augustus: And our Advices from Breslau say, that a Suedish Officer had lately pass'd through that Place in his way to Stockholm, with Letters from the King of Sweden to the Senate. They write from Berlin, that Monsieur Marshall is preparing to fet out for the Court of Great Britain; and 'tis believ'd, that after he has finish'd his Negotiations there, he will go and reside at the Hague

Turin, Nov. 28. N. S. The Duke of Savoy being resolv'd to rebuild his Palace at Rivoli, that was burn'd by Mareschal Catinat the last War, has been treating about it with feveral Persons, who have undertaken to finish it according to the Plan agreed on, for One million four hundred thousand Livres. His Royal Highness has given Orders for Levelling a Hill which commands Suza, and designs to aug-ment the Fortifications of that Place, Exilles, and other important Posts, the better to secure 'em from the Infults of the Enemy. They write from Genoa, that the British Fleet, with the Imperial Troops, Sail'd from Vado the Twenty-seventh for Barcelona. where 'tis believ'd they are fafely arriv'd, the Wind having continu'd fair.

Hague, Decemb. 18. N. S. The Night between the Tenth and Eleventh arriv'd a Courier with Difpatches from the Emperor to his Ministers reliding here, the Contents of which have been communicated to the States-General. Monsieur Petkum, Envoy from the Duke of Holstein, is return'd from Amsterdam, where he has been for some time, and will go from hence to Frankfort, to wait upon his Im-perial Majesty. Prince Kurakin and Monsieur Matueof, Ministers from his Czarish Majesty, have been lately in Conference with the Grand Penfionary. The Yachts on Board of which were Count Gallas, and the three Commissioners for Inspecting the British Troops in Spain, are arriv'd at Rotterdam.
