The Duke of Savoy being resolv'd to rebuild his Palace at Rivoli, that was burn'd by Mareschal Catinat the last War, has been treating about it with feveral Persons, who have undertaken to finish it according to the Plan agreed on, for One million four hundred thousand Livres. His Royal Highness has given Orders for Levelling a Hill which commands Suza, and designs to aug-ment the Fortifications of that Place, Exilles, and other important Posts, the better to secure 'em from the Infults of the Enemy.
