A PROCLAMATION

*Altering the Proclamation of the 20th April 1983
Determining the Design for the One Pound Coin*

ELIZABETH R.

Whereas under section 3 (1) (b) and (h) of the Coinage Act 1971 We have power, with the advice of Our Privy Council, by Proclamation to determine the design of any coin to be made at Our Mint and to alter any Proclamation previously made under the said section:

And Whereas by Our Proclamation dated the twentieth day of April 1983 We ordered that a new coin of nickel brass of the denomination of one pound should be made at Our Mint:

And Whereas it appears to Us desirable to determine new designs for the said one pound coin.

We, therefore, in pursuance of the said section 3 (1) (b) and (h) and of all other powers enabling Us in that behalf

do hereby, by and with the advice of Our Privy Council, proclaim, direct and ordain as follows:

1. The following section shall be substituted for section 2 of Our said Proclamation of the twentieth day of April 1983:

"2. The design for the said coin shall be as follows:

For the obverse impression Our effigy with the inscription "ELIZABETH II D·G·REG·F·D·" and the date of the year, and for the reverse either

(a) the Ensigns Armorial of Our United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland,

(b) an Oak Tree enfiling a representation of Our Royal Diadem,

(c) a Thistle eradicated enfiling a representation of Our Royal Diadem,

(d) a Leek eradicated enfiling a representation of Our Royal Diadem, or

(e) a Flax Plant eradicated enfiling a representation of Our Royal Diadem

and beneath the same words "ONE POUND".

The coin shall have a graining upon the edge and in incuse letters the inscription "DECUS ET TUTAMEN" or, in the case of a coin bearing the impression of a Thistle, "NEMO ME IMPUNE LACESSIT" or, in the case of a coin bearing the impression of a Leek, "PLEIDIOL WYF I'M GWLAD".

2. This Proclamation shall come into force on the twenty-third day of June One thousand nine hundred and eighty-three.

Given at Our Court at Buckingham Palace, this twenty-second day of June in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and eighty-three and in the thirty-second year of Our Reign.
