WATER RESOURCES ACT

NOTICE OF APPLICATION FOR LICENCE TO OBSTRUCT OR IMPEDE THE FLOW OF AN INLAND WATER BY MEANS OF IMPOUNDING WORKS.

Notice is hereby given that an application is being made to the Severn-Trent Water Authority by P. J. G. Herrick, Esq., B.A., Borough Secretary and Clerk of Melton Borough Council, Warwick Lodge, Dalby Road, Melton Mowbray, Leicestershire LE13 0BW, for a licence to obstruct or impede the flow of the Scaford Brook, being a tributary of the River Eye by means of an earth dam at NGR SK 758 205 at Scaford, near Melton Mowbray, Leicestershire.

The object of the impounding water by means of the works is to create a flood storage reservoir for the purpose of alleviating flooding downstream in Melton Mowbray. The capacity of the reservoir at overflow level will be 500,000 cubic metres. Equivalent to 1:100 year temporary

flood storage. The capacity of a permanent upstream amenity lake will be approximately 30,000 cubic metres.

Further details of the application are: The flood storage reservoir and channel improvements downstream are being designed by the Severn-Trent Water Authority, Soar Division who are acting as Consulting Engineers on behalf of Melton Borough Council. Overall supervision of the design and construction of the dam is being undertaken by an Engineer appointed under the Reservoir Safety Provisions Act 1930.

A copy of the application and of any map, plan or other document submitted with it may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Warwick Lodge, Melton Mowbray, at all reasonable hours during the period beginning on 22nd July 1983 and ending 22nd August 1983.
