The Trunk Road (A483) (Builth Wells, Powys) (One Way Traffic) Order 1983

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under sections 1 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 as amended which shall come into operation on 24th October 1983. The effect of the Order will be that no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to proceed in the length of trunk road specified in the Schedule to this notice in a direction other than from west to east.

A copy of the Order, copies of the Orders to be revoked, together with a plan and a statement of reasons for making the Order may be seen during normal office hours at the offices of the Brecknock Borough Council, Oxford House, The Watton, Brecon, during a period of 6 weeks from 27th September 1983.
