The County Council of West Midlands (Malthouse Lane, Salfley) (One Way Traffic) Order 1983

Notice is hereby given that the above-named Council propose to make an Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, section 186, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, section 24 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, the effect of which will be to prohibit any vehicle proceeding in that length of Malthouse Lane in a direction other than south-easterly from its junction with Wright Road for a distance of 40 metres measured from that junction.

The County Council of West Midlands (Park Road, Sparkhill) (Prohibition of Waiting) (Amendment) Order 1983

Notice is hereby given that on 14th November 1983 the above-named Council made the above-named Order under section 1 (1), (2) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, section 186, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, section 24 and Schedule 6 to the Road Traffic Act 1974, and of all other enabling powers and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with section 84C(1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967 the effect of which is to introduce no waiting at any time on both sides of Park Road from its junction with Showell Green Lane to a point approximately 93 metres east of that junction.

The Order will come into operation on 20th November 1983.

HACKNEY LONDON BOROUGH COUNCIL

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Hoxton Street Conservation Area

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the London Borough of Hackney as local planning authority in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by section 277 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, as amended, have designated the land in the Schedule to this notice as an area of special architectural or historic interest, the character and appearance of which it is desirable to preserve and enhance.

The effect of designation is that special attention should be paid to the desirability of preserving or enhancing the character or appearance of the area designated. In particular, controls are applied regarding the demolition of buildings (owners are required to apply to the Council for Listed Building Consent before carrying out works of demolition to any building or part of a building within the areas); control is also imposed in respect of the display of advertisements and the felling, topping and lopping, etc., of trees within the areas. Penalties apply in the event of violations against this control.

The Conservation Area has effect from the date of the Council's resolution to designate on 31st October 1983.
