Extinguishment of Public Rights of Way

Part of Midgery Lane, Fulwood and Footpaths Off Midgery Lane

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment in exercise of his powers under section 23 of the New Towns Act 1981, has made an Order extinguishing the public rights of way over the following routes shown hatched black or by a broken black line on the map hereinafter referred to—

- (1) That part of Midgery Lane starting from a point marked "N" on the map approximately 190 metres south-east of its junction with D'Urton Lane, extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 280 metres to a point marked "O" on the map adjacent to Midgery Cottage.
- (2) That part of Footpath No. 31 starting from a point marked "A" on the map at its junction with Midgery Lane approximately 65 metres south-east of point "N" referred to above extending in a north-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 190 metres to a point marked "B" on the map at its junction with the M6 motorway boundary.
- (3) That part of Footpath No. 33 starting from a point marked "C" on the map at the M6 motorway boundary extending in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 250 metres to a point marked "K" on the map to the south of the property known as "The Hollins".
- (4) That part of the Footpath No. 35 starting from a point "K" on the map extending in a southerly direction for a distance of approximately 90 metres to a point marked "D" on the map.
- (5) That part of Footpath No. 34 starting from point "K" on the map extending in an easterly direction for a distance of approximately 210 metres to a point marked "L" on the map.
- (6) That part of Footpath No. 24 (which is a continuation of Footpath No. 34) starting from a point marked "L" on the map extending in a south-easterly direction for a distance of approximately 130 metres to a point marked "M" on the map.
- (7) That part of Footpath No. 36 starting from a point marked "E" on the map, extending in a westerly direction for a distance of approximately 145 metres through point "F" to point "G" on the map to the south of "My Uncle's Farm".

- (8) That part of Footpath No. 37 starting from point "F" on the map, extending in a south-westerly direction for a distance of approximately 190 metres through point "H" to point "J" on the map at its junction with Midgery Lane.

The Order is dated 7th December 1983 and a copy of it and of the map referred to in it showing the rights of way which have been extinguished may be inspected at the offices of the Central Lancashire Development Corporation, Cuerden Hall, Bamber Bridge, Preston.
