and which were imported into the United Kingdom on 14th October 1981 at Stansted Airport, and detained at R.A.F. Northolt, have been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the ground that:

The said goods being imported goods chargeable with a duty of customs were without payment of that duty removed from their place of importation otherwise than as provided by or under the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979; whereby and by force of section 49 (1) (a) of the Customs and Excise Management Act 1979 the said goods are liable to forfeiture.

If you claim that the said goods are not liable to forfeiture you must within 1 month from the date of this notice of seizure give notice of your claim in accordance with the said Schedule to the said Act. In default of such notice the said goods will be deemed to have been duly condemned as forfeited and will be liable to be disposed of in such manner as the Commissioners of Customs and Excise may direct. If you make such claim within the time aforesaid, legal proceedings will be taken for the condemnation thereof.
