ROAD TRAFFIC REGULATION ACT 1967

The County of Hereford and Worcester (40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (No.) Order 1984 (Imposition of 40 m.p.h. Speed Limit) (Spennells Valley Road, Kidderminster).

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Hereford and Worcester propose to make an Order under section 74 (1) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, Schedule 19 to the Local Government Act 1972, and of all other enabling powers the effect of which will be to impose a speed limit of 40 m.p.h. of that length of Spennells Valley Road in the Town of Kidderminster in the District of Wyre Forest in the County of Hereford and Worcester which extends from its junction with A449 Chester Road South for a distance of 900 metres (2,952 feet) to its eastern junction with Heronswood Road.

A copy of the draft Order, together with a map showing the length of road concerned and a statement of the Council's reasons for proposing to make the Order may be examined during normal office hours at Wyre Forest District Council Offices, Civic Centre, Stourport-on-Severn, County Council Offices, Tower Buildings, Blackwell Street, Kidderminster, and County Hall, Spetchley Road, Worcester.

HOVE BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Borough of Hove (Parking Places and Traffic Regulation) Order 1974 Amendment Order 1984

Notice is hereby given that Hove Borough Council, as agents for East Sussex County Council, on 13th February 1984, made an Order under sections 1, 28, 31, 35, 36, 37, 39 and 84D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended. The Order comes into operation on 2nd April 1984.

The Order amends the Borough of Hove (Parking Places and Traffic Regulation) Order 1974 as follows:

- (i) An existing limited waiting/permit holder parking space in Lansdowne Road (north side, east of Furze Hill) is converted into a motor cycle parking place available all hours, all days.
- (ii) The existing motor cycle parking place in Brunswick Place (west side, north end) is converted into a limited waiting (2 hours, Mondays to Saturdays, 8 a.m. to 6 p.m.) and permit holder parking space for passenger or goods vehicles (as defined in the 1974 Order).
- (iii) Waiting is prohibited at all times in part of Brunswick Street East (east side, near south end, for 5 metres only). It will be possible without amending the 1974 Order to add a further limited waiting/permit holder parking space nearby to make up for the space lost by the new prohibition of waiting.

A copy of the Order and the relevant map may be seen at the address mentioned below between 8.45 a.m. and 1 p.m. and between 2 p.m. and 5 p.m., Mondays to Fridays (excluding public holidays).

Any person who wishes to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the ground that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any Instrument made under it has not been complied with in relation to the Order may within 6 weeks of the date on which the Order was made make application for the purpose to the High Court.

HUMBERSIDE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Humberside (Boothferry Borough) (West Street/Widop Street, Goole) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1984.

Notice is hereby given that the Humberside County Council propose to make a Road Traffic Regulation Order the effect of which will be:

- (a) To prohibit any vehicle from being driven in the following road:

Unnamed highway 25 metres north of Widop Street, from a point 34 metres from its junction with Pasture Road for a distance of 42 metres in a westerly direction.

- (b) To prohibit any vehicle, except for pedal cycles, from being driven in the following road:

West Street, from a point 44 metres from its junction with Pasture Road for a distance of 5 metres in a westerly direction.

HUMBERSIDE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Humberside (Scunthorpe Borough) (Cole Street) (One Way Traffic) Order 1984

Notice is hereby given that on 9th February 1984, the Humberside County Council made this Order which will be operative from 27th February 1984 and the effect of which will be:

- (a) to impose a one-way traffic flow in the following road in Scunthorpe:

Cole Street, from its junction with Mary Street to its junction with John Street, in a south to north direction.

- (b) to revoke part of the Borough of Scunthorpe (Various Streets) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1968.

The County of Humberside (Scunthorpe Borough) (Burn Road, Scotter Road and Stanley Road) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) Order 1984.
