RATES OF INTEREST ON LOANS BY THE PUBLIC WORKS LOAN COMMISSIONERS TO LOCAL **AUTHORITIES**

NOTICE

TREASURY MINUTE dated 14th March 1984.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury read section 3(2) of the National Loans Act 1968 (1968 c. 13 as amended) whereby any sums borrowed from the Public Works Loan Commissioners shall bear interest at such rates as the Treasury may determine from time to time in accordance with section 5 of the said Act.

My Lords understand that the Public Works Loan Commissioners will be operating arrangements under which local authorities are permitted to borrow from the Commissioners up to a specified quota at a certain fixed rate of interest and in excess of such quota at one of two higher fixed rates.

In accordance therewith the Chancellor of the Exchequer now recommends that with effect from 14th March 1984 and until the coming into operation of a further determination:

I. The rate of interest applicable to any such fixed rate loan will be that in force on the day the authority applies to borrow or, if the application is before noon three working days before the loan is credited to the account of the authority's banker, the rate in force at 11 a.m. two banking days before credit day;

II. Different rates of interest shall be charged on such fixed rate loans according to whether the principal of a loan is repaid by instalments or at maturity and, if repaid by instalments, whether by equal instalments of the principal with interest paid on the decreasing balance of the principal (E.I.P.), or by instalments of equal repayments of the principal and interest paid thereon (E.R.);

 - (c) a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes if it is reasonably neessary for that vehicle to enter or proceed in a bus lane or the prohibited road; or
 - (d) any vehicle being used in connection with the removal of any obstruction in a bus lane or the prohibited road; or

- (e) a vehicle being used for purposes in connection with or the statutory powers or duties of a local authority or the supply of gas, water or electricity, or in connection with any building operation, demolition or excavation in or adjacent to a bus lane or the prohibited road, provided that in all circumstances it is reasonably necessary for the vehicle to enter that bus lane or prohibited road, or lane or prohibited road; or
- (f) any vehicle which enters a bus lane or the prohibited road for the sole purpose of waiting for a period not exceeding 2 minutes to enable a person suffering from any disability or injury (including blindness) which seriously impairs his ability to walk to board or alight from that vehicle; or
- (g) any vehicle which enters a bus lane for the sole purpose of waiting for a period not exceeding 2 min-utes to enable a person suffering from any disability or injury (including blindness) which seriously impairs his ability to walk to board or alight from that vehicle;
- (h) any vehicle if the driver thereof is obliged to enter or proceed in the bus lane or the prohibited road in order to avoid an accident and forthwith causes that vehicle to leave that bus lane or prohibited road;

If the provisions of the Order continue in operation for a period of not less than 6 months, the Council will consider in due course whether the provisions of the Order should be reproduced and continued in force indefinitely by means of Orders under section 6 of the said Act of 1967.
