2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000, £10,000, £250,000 or £1,000,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday, 2nd July 1984, to Friday, 6th July 1984 inclusive and will be due 91 days after date.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than \$50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated and the net amount per cent. (being a multiple of one halfpenny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent on the same day as Tenders are received to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part. Payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. on the day on which the relative Bills are to be
