The Trunk Road (A487) (Dublin Street, Tremadog, Gwynedd) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1984

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under section 1 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, which shall come into operation on 9th July 1984. The effect of the Order is to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle at any time on the side of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

The Order contains exceptions for picking up or setting down passengers; loading or unloading goods, building, industrial or demolition operations and carrying out essential services connected with the maintenance of the road, and the supply of gas, water and electricity.

The usual exceptions are also provided for vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge in accordance with the orange badge scheme.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan and statement of reasons for making the Order, may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of Dwyfor District Council, Pwllheli, Gwynedd, during a period of 6 weeks from 22nd June 1984.
