The Trunk Road (A477) (Kilgetty, Dyfed) (De-restriction) Order 1984

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under sections 72 and 73 of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, which will come into operation on 20th July 1984.

The effect of the Order is to de-restrict the lengths of road specified in the Schedule to this notice.

A copy of the Order together with a plan and statement of reasons for the making of the Order, may be seen during normal office hours at the offices of South Pembrokeshire District Council, District Offices, Llanion Park, Pembroke Dock, during a period of 6 weeks from 20th July 1984.

Copies of the Order may be obtained, free of charge, on application to the Welsh Office, Transport, Highways and Planning Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL, quoting ref. WR16/2/78.

SCHEDULE

Those lengths of the St. Clears-Nash Trunk Road (A477) at Kilgetty in the County of Dyfed which extend:

- (a) from a point 130 metres south-west of the centre point of the Begelly Roundabout in a general easterly direction to a point 140 metres south-east of the said Roundabout; and
- (b) from a point 75 metres south-west of the centre line of the Sardis Road Overbridge in a general north-easterly direction to a point 235 metres south-east of the said Overbridge. (5 SI)

The Trunk Roads (A487 and A44) (Various Roads, Aberystwyth) (Prohibition and Restriction of Waiting) 1984

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for Wales has made an Order under sections 1, 9 and 34D of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended, which will come into operation on 27th July 1984. The effect of the Order is:

- (a) to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday, for more than 60 minutes in any period of 2 hours, on the side of road specified in Schedule 1 to this notice;
- (b) to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day, for more than 2 hours, in any period of 4 hours on the side of road specified in Schedule 2 to this notice;
- (c) to prohibit the waiting of any vehicle, between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on any day other than a Sunday, for more than 2 hours in any period of 4 hours, on the side of road specified in Schedule 3 to this notice.

The Order will contain exceptions for picking up or setting down passengers; loading or unloading goods, building, industrial or demolition operations; carry out essential services connected with the maintenance of the road, and the supply of gas, water and electricity.

The usual exceptions are also provided for vehicles displaying a disabled person's badge in accordance with the "orange badge" scheme.

A copy of the Order, a copy of the Orders to be revoked, together with a plan and statement of reasons for making the Order may be seen during normal office hours at the Ceredigion District Council, Town Hall, Aberystwyth, during a period of 6 weeks from 6th July 1984.

Copies of the Order may be obtained free of charge, on application to the Welsh Office, Transport, Highways and Planning Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff, quoting ref. WR 15/2/187.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1967, as amended by Part IX of the Transport Act 1968, or that any requirement of that Act or of any Instruments made under it, has not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may, within the aforesaid period of 6 weeks, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

SCHEDULE 1

The western side of that length of the Fishguard-Bangor Trunk Road (A487) known as Bridge Street at Aberystwyth in the County of Dyfed, which extends from a point 15 yards north of its junction with South Road in a northerly direction to a point 47 yards south of its junction with Princess Street.

SCHEDULE 2

The north-eastern side of that length of the Fishguard-Bangor Trunk Road (A487) known as Thespian Street at Aberystwyth in the County of Dyfed, which extends from a point 16 yards north-west of its junction with Poplar Row in a general northerly direction to a point 10 yards south-east of its junction with Cambrian Street.

SCHEDULE 3

The south-eastern side of that length of the Fishguard-Bangor Trunk Road (A487) known as Alexandra Road at Aberystwyth in the County of Dyfed, which extends from a point 31 yards south-west of its junction with Stanley Road in a general south-westerly direction to a point 17 yards north-east of its junction with Elm Tree Avenue. (6 SI)

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the diversion of a highway by the stopping up of the highway described in the Schedule to this notice to enable development to be carried out.

The proposed Order requires the provision of a new highway which will be the diversion.

During 28 days from 20th July 1984, copies of the draft Order and the relevant plan, may be inspected during normal office hours at the offices of Ceredigion District Council, Town Hall, Aberystwyth.

Objections, specifying the grounds on which they are made, quoting ref. TRPC 15/2/7, must be sent to the Welsh Office, Transport, Highways and Planning Group, Government Buildings, Ty Glas Road, Llanishen, Cardiff CF4 5PL, by 18th August 1984.
