imposed by the Haringey (Waiting and Loading Restriction) Order 1978;

(b) so that the hours during which the existing prohibition applies:

(i) on waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle) would be changed so that it would apply at any time in the lengths of streets specified in Schedule 2 to this notice

(ii) on waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle would be changed so that it would apply between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Satur-days inclusive in the length of street specified in Schedule 3 to this notice ;

(iii) on waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle would be changed so that it would apply between 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in the length of street specified in Schedule 4 to this notice;

(c) so that waiting by vehicles (otherwise than for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading and unloading a vehicle) would be prohibited:
(i) at any time in the lengths of street specified in Schedule 5 to this notice;
(ii) hetware 2 a street 620 to the street specified in Schedule 5 to this notice;

(ii) between 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the length of street specified in Schedule 6 to this notice

(d) so that waiting by vehicles for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a

ing or contening goods or totaling or unrotating a vehicle would be prohibited between: (i) 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in Monument Way (1) between the eastern kerb-line of High Road, Tottenham and a point 55 metres east of that kerb-line; and (2) between the western kerb-line of The Hale and a point 25 metres west of that kerb-line; (ii) 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 4.30 p.m. and

(ii) 8 a.m. and 9.30 a.m. and between 4.30 p.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in Monument Way between a point 55 metres east of the east-ern kerb-line of High Road, Tottenham and a point 25 metres west of the western kerb-line of The Hale; (e) so that unless prohibited as above, waiting by vehicles

for the purpose of delivering or collecting goods or loading or unloading a vehicle for a period of more than 20 minutes in the same place would be prohibited between:

(i) 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. throughout the week in the lengths of street specified in Schedule 5 to this notice; (ii) 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the length of street specified in Schedule 6

to this notice; (f) the sale or offer for sale of goods from a vehicle

would be prohibited, except on a Sunday, unless there is in force a valid licence issued by the Haringey Borough Council or the goods are immediately taken into or delivered at the premises adjacent to the vehicle from which the sale is affected;

(g) the use of any vehicle or of any animal or the wear ing of fancy dress or other costume, wholly or mainly for the purpose of advertising, would be prohibited.
4. The prohibitions referred to in paragraph 3 (c), (d)

and (e) above would not apply in respect of anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police conwith the permission or at the direction of a police con-stable in uniform or in certain circumstances e.g., the picking up or setting down of passengers; the carrying out of statutory powers or duties; the taking in of petrol, etc., from roadside petrol stations; to licensed street traders, etc. The usual exemptions relating to vehicles displaying a disabled person's "orange badge" would apply. 5. The general effect of the Haringey (Restriction of Waiting on Bus Stops) (No. 1 1982) (Amendment No.) Order 198 would be further to amend the Haringey

Order 198 would be further to amend the Haringey (Restriction of Waiting on Bus Stops) (No. 1) Traffic Order 1982 so as to prohibit all vehicles from waiting between 7 a.m. and 7 p.m. throughout the week on any area of carriageway lying within or adjacent to the lengths of road specified in Schedule 7 to this notice and which area will be marked on the carriageway thereof by a yellow "bus stop" marking and by a single yellow line within that marking. The prohibition would not apply:

(a) to a vehicle being used to provide a London bus service, whilst picking up or setting down passengers;

(b) to a vehicle being used for ambulance, fire brigade or police purposes;

(c) in certain circumstances, to a vehicle being used in the service of a local authority, in connection with building operations, etc., adjacent to the bus stop or the removal of an obstruction to traffic or the repair, etc., of the highway or of any service therein;

- (d) to a vehicle waiting for not more than 2 minutes to enable a person to board or alight or to load or unload his personal baggage. The limit of 2 minutes would not apply if the person has serious difficulty in walking or is blind;
- (e) where the person in control of the vehicle is required by law to stop or does so in order to avoid an accident;

(f) to anything done with the permission or at the direction of a police constable in uniform.

6. A copy of each of the proposed Orders, of the above-mentioned Orders of 1971, 1973, 1978 and 1982 (and of the Orders which have amended those Orders) and of the Council's statement of reasons for proposing to make the Orders can be inspected during normal office hours on Mondays to Fridays inclusive until the expiration of a period of 21 days from the date on which this notice is published in Room B.72, The County Hall, London SE1 7PB.
