stopping up of the highway described in the Schedule to this notice to enable development to be carried out.

SCHEDULE

The highway to be stopped up is at Argoed near Oakdale in the county of Gwent and is that length of the un-named highway connecting Manmoel Road with Darren Felen Farm, which extends from a point 310 yards west of its junction with Manmoel Road in a general westerly direction for a distance of 828 yards. · (3 SI)
