CERTIFICATES OF TAX DEPOSIT

On and after 16th October 1984 the rates of interest on deposits accepted under the Prospectus (Series 6) dated 11th October 1982 will be as follows:

(a) for deposits of £100,000 or over:

WELSH OFFICE

The Secretary of State for Wales hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under section 209 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971 to authorise the stopping-up of the highways described in the Schedule to this notice to enable development to be carried out.

Copies of the Order may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable hours at the offices of Arfon Borough Council, Cwellyn, Llanberis Road, Caernarfon.

Any person aggrieved by the Order and desiring to question the validity thereof, or of any provision contained therein, on the ground that it is not within the powers of the above Act or that any requirement of that Act or of any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the Order, may within 6 weeks of 18th October 1984 apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

SCHEDULE

(All distances are approximate)

The Highways to be stopped up are at Bangor in the County of Gwynedd and are:

- the entire length of Berllanbach which extends from its junction with Waterloo Street to its northern junction with Tan-y-Fynwent; and
- the easternside of Waterloo Street which extends:

(i) from its junction with Tan-y-Fynwent in a general southerly direction for a distance of 60 metres and to a depth of 1 metre;
