HE Emperor has very earneftly invited the Elector of Treves to be prefent at his Co4 ronation at Presburg, in Hungary, which is, deferr'd till the next Month, becaufe the Dèputies of Tranfylvania, who are to affif at that Ceremony, will be oblig'd to remain upon the Frontiers for three Weeks, becaufe the Plague has been in their Country, and there will not be fufficient Forage about Presbourg before that time, for the numerous Retinue that will attend his Imperial Majefty. The five young Princes of Bavaria have obtain'd the Emperor's leave to refide at Gratz, where his Majefty has appointed them Governors, and Mony for their Expences according to their Quality. We have Advice from Petersbourgs that his Czarifh Majefty will fet out from thence to Pomerania after Eafter; and that Prince Menzikoff will be at Koningsbourg, about the Fifth of this Inflant, from whence he is to proceed to Coldinguen, to Confer with the King of Denmark, conderning the North. The Suedes are apprehensive the Danes will make their greateft Efforts on the fide of Norway, and that they will endeavour at a Defeent in the Dutchy of Bremen. The Reports continue, that the King of Sueden remains ftill at Bender, and the Palatine of Kiovia at Jaffi. Hamburgh, April 19. N. S. The Diet of Warfaw

Hamburgh, April 19. N. S. The Diet of Warfaw began its Selfions upon the Fifth of this Month, and after long Debates, the Count Denhoff, who is intirely in the Intereft of King Auguftus, was elected Marfhal of the Confederacy, from which beginning a good Iffueis expected in their following Confultations. The first Propefal which the Senators made to his Polish Majefty, was to defire him to fix the Term of two Months for the departure of the Mufcovite Forces out of that Kingdom. His Majefty has given Orders for the Regiment of his Guards, and three other Regiments of Foot to March into Pomerania with a Train of Artillery, confifting of twelve Pieces of Cannon. Prince Menzikoff is already gone from Elbing, in his Paffage for Pomerania, but that he will ftay fome time at Berlin, to make fome Propofals from the Czar his Mafter to his Pruffian Majefty. The Saedish Véffels upon the Elbe, have given Chafe to fome Danes, and their mutual Hoftilities ftill continue. There was a ftrong Report in this City a few Days ago, that an Action had happened between the Daimith Troops and the Suedes in Pomerania, but though two confiderable Parties approach'd very near one another, yet they parted without any Engagement.

Braffels, April 21. N. S. The English Troops which were part of this Garrison, march'd hence on the Fourteenth Instant, to the general Rendezvous of the Army. General Wrangel has taken the Command of the Forces remaining here, in the room of the General Baron de Heyden, who commands the

Dutch Troops that were Quarter'd here laft Winter. Two Spanish Regiments, and two Squidrons of Dragoons are expected here, which will compleat this Garrison to fear, as that we shall have no occasion to fear the Infults of the Enemy during the approaching Gampaign. We have Advice from Namur, that the French have evacuated the Forts and Califes of Namur, and that the Bavarian Forces have taken Possible for them. Nothing has pass d between the two Armies on the Frontiers of Artois. The Designs that have been form'd for driving the Enemy from the Senfette have been rendred impracticable, because our Forces cannot march to wards them, by realion of the continuance of the ill Weather.

Utreebt, April 22. N. S. Yefterday a Conference was held here, as utual, between as many of the Minifters of the Allies as are at prefent refiding here: They who went to the Hague are expected back this Evening, in order to affilt at the General Conference to Morrow, although it is not yet certainly known, whether that will produce any thing more material than fome of the preceeding Ones have lately done. Monfieur Palmquift, Envoy Extraordinary from the King of Sueden to the States-General, who has likewile the Character of Plenipotentiary for the Congreß of Peace from the Circle of the Upper Rhine, is come from the Hague, and after making a fhort flay, will return thither, having no other Bufinels at prefent, but the providing for his future Accommodation here. The Minifters of Parma, Modena, and of the Republick of Genoa, are all arriv'd at this Place. No General Conference was held upon the Twentieth, becaufe it was appointed for a Solemn Faft, which was kept throughout all the Provinces;

Hagke, April 20. N. S. Two Days ago a Deputation from the Affembly of the States-General, went to the Houfe of the Earl of Strafford; and having had a Conference with his Excellency, that lafted about half at Hour, return'd to give an account of the refult of it to the Affentbly. Prince Eugene of Savoy will fet out to Morrow, to put himfelf at the Head of the Ariny in Flanders; he came hither Yefterday in the Morning, together with Count Sinzendorff," and in the Evening had a Conference with the Earl of Strafford and the Deputies of the States-General; and the Council of State, which lafted two Hours. All the Plenipotentiaries of the Allies, who came hither from Utrecht, are returning thither, to be prefent at the General Conference that is to be held to Morrow.
