They write from Warsaw, that the Muscovite Ge-neral Gallezin was march'd from the Territory of Lonfinsk with his Forces, and had taken his Route directly towards Pomerania. The Prince D'holoruki has Quarter'd Ninety four Men more than for-merly, in some Houses call'd Neeringe, under the Cannon of this Town; and has wrote to the Magifirates to give them sofice; to which they have return'd an Answer, but it is not yet known, whether it be to his Satisfaction.

At the Court at St. James's, the 17th of April, 1712, have sent their Deputies to confer with those of the Elector of Mentz, Triers and the Palarine, concerning the necessary Provisions for these Troops, and how their Expences may be defray'd. Hamburg, April 19. N. S. The Imperial Com? mission, to terminate the Differences and compose the Troubles of this City, will begin their Sessions upon Wednesday next. As the Hostilities between the Danes and Suedes continue still upon the Elbe; fo we have likewise frequent Accounts of Vessels belonging to this City, which are seiz'd by the Danes; and, it is faid, that the King of Denmark has given Order for a Publick Sale of the Effects of such Vesseis from Hamburg, as have been taken and carried into Norway.
