The Queen's most Excellent Majesty in Council.

THIS Day his Grace, John Duke of Athol was, by Her Majesty's Command, Sworn One of the Lords of Her Majesty's Most Honourable Privy Council, and took his Place at the Board accordingly.

Dantzick, March 30. N. S. We have Advice from Leopold of the Sixteenth, That since the surrender of Asoph, there was no likelihood of any interruption of the Peace between the Port and his Czarish Majesty; and that the Prince of Walachia, would no longer furnish Provisions from the side of Jassi. to the Suedish Troops, and those of the Palatin of Kiovia, that lie upon the Banks of the Dnieffer. They write from Warsaw, that the Muscovite General Gallezin was march'd from the Territory of Lonsinsk with his Forces, and had taken his Route directly towards Pomerania. The Prince D'holoruki has Quarter'd Ninety four Men more than formerly, in some Houses call'd Neeringe, under the Cannon of this Town; and has wrote to the Magistrates to give them notice; to which they have return'd an Answer, but it is not yet known, whether it be to his Satisfaction.

Warsaw, April 8. N. S. The General Diet for the Kingdom of Poland, having began its Sessions in this Place upon the Fifth of this Month, has receiv'd Proposals from King Augustus, to be taken into Consideration, to the Effect following; That the States of this Republick, in the present Conjunction, seeing that the War with Sweden is still continu'd, do provide for the Defence of their Country, by the increase of their Militia, and raising of more Infantry. That the Payments of the Army be made Quarterly, and supported by a General Contribution: That the Garrisons on the Frontiers be provided with Corn and other Necessaries: That Stores be put into the Arsenals of the Republick: That the Territory of Elbing, and other Pledges of the Republick, be redeem'd. That the Mint be open'd, and the Money brought to the Standard of Foreign Coins: That care be taken concerning his Majesty's Revenues, and particularly of the Salt Mines of Cracow: And lastly, A perfect Unanimity is recommended to them in all Matters relating to the Publick Good of their Country.

Frankfort, April 5. N. S. The Members of the Circle of the Upper Rhine are separated, and those of the Electoral Circle of the Rhine are met, in order to settle Matters relating to the approaching Campaign. Three Regiments of Imperial Horse, which lately pass'd the Danube, have this Day taken up their Quarters here, but will soon be upon their march for Flanders; the gross of the Infantry will pass by this City by Water the next Week. The Members of the Circle of the Upper Rhine,

have sent their Deputies to confer with those of the Elector of Mentz, Triers and the Palatine, concerning the necessary Provisions for these Troops, and how their Expences may be defray'd. The Elector of Mentz pass'd Yesterday in the Evening through this Place for Aschaffenburg. Monsieur Vulteius, Minister of his Highness the Landgrave of Hesse Cassel, is come back hither, having executed his Commission for taking the Oath of Homage from the Subjects of the Country of Dieß, in the Name of his Master; as being Tutor to the young Stadtholder of Freiseland, and Prince of Nassau.

Hanover, April 16. N. S. Several Complaints have been made at this Court, concerning Ships belonging to the City of Hamburg, which have been taken by the Danes, in Places that are Dependant upon this Electorate; and that they have likewise made Prize of a Ship belonging to some of the Elector's Subjects, who are Merchants in the Town of Harburg; but it is hop'd these Matters will be adjusted upon a due Representation.

Hamburg, April 19. N. S. The Imperial Commission, to terminate the Differences and compose the Troubles of this City, will begin their Sessions upon Wednesday next. As the Hostilities between the Danes and Suedes continue still upon the Elbe; so we have likewise frequent Accounts of Vessels belonging to this City, which are seiz'd by the Danes; and, it is said, that the King of Denmark has given Order for a Publick Sale of the Effects of such Vessels from Hamburg, as have been taken and carried into Norway. The Baron Grote is arriv'd here this Day from Hanover, and is to proceed to Coldingen, to make a Remonstrance, concerning a Vessel belonging to Harburg, that has been seiz'd by a Danish Yacht, and to require a Restitution.

Kinsale, April 8. This Day arriv'd here Her Majesty's Ship the Norwich, from New England but last from the River Kinnare, and under her Convoy the Ships following, viz. the America, Bond, Casvell Frigate, Nathaniel of London, and Providence, all from New England, Virginia, &c: As also the Hallifax from Jamaica, the Mary Pink from New England, and the Transitory from the Canaries; the three last came under Convoy of Her Majesty's Ship the Hastings from Beerhaven, the Hastings is gone to Cork. The Rochester and Folkstone, sail'd Yesterday to Cruise to the Westward, and took some Ships from Cork under their Convoy.

Whitehaven, April 13. Yesterday a small Brigantine belonging to this Port, Captain Rutbald Commander, arrived safe from Carolina, with Pitch, Tar and Rice.

Falmouth, April 14. Yesterday put in here by Contrary Winds, Her Majesty's Ship the Monk, with five Vessels for Ireland.
