HER Majesty has been graciously pleas'd to Constitute and Appoint his Grace Charles Duke of Shrewsbury, Lord Chamberlain of Her Majesty's Household to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Salop.

His Grace George Duke of Northumberland, to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Berks.

The Right Honourable Thomas Earl of Thanet, to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Cumberland, and likewise of the County of Westmorland.

The Right Honourable Mountague Earl of Abingdon, to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Oxford.

The Right Reverend Father in God, and Right Honourable Nathaniel Lord Crew, Lord Bishop of Durham, to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Durham.

The Right Honourable William Viscount Cheyne, to be Lord Lieutenant of the County of Buckingham.

Florence, April 19. N. S. The German Troops have receiv'd the Succours which they had for some time expected from Naples, and having made a considerable Breach in the Fort of Monte Philippo, they design to Storm it in a few Days. The Spaniards have drawn several Detachments from Porto Hercole into that Fort, and made vigorous Sallies, but were always repuls'd with loss. We have Advice from Genoa, that the Empress Consort had been very ill of the Measles at Barcelona, but that she was now recover'd.

Turin, April 20. N. S. Upon repeated Intelligence from our Frontiers of the Enemies dispositions there, to undertake some considerable Enterprize, as soon as the Snows are melted, his Royal Highness has thought proper to reinforce the Troops at Sufa, by two of his own Regiments and four German Battalions, which are to march this Morning from St. Baleine. All the other Troops which are to make the ensuing Campaign, will be ready to march by

the beginning of the next Month, with their Tents, and every thing necessary to take the Field, so that they will be in Piedmont a Month sooner than they have been in former Years.

Hanover, May 3. N. S. They write from Dresden, that the Diet of Poland is concluded to the satisfaction of King Augustus, and that his Majesty design'd to set out from Warsaw on the Twenty sixth of the last Month. The Senators have renew'd their Oath of Fidelity to the King; they have confirm'd the Confederation of Sandomir, and taken care, that the Army of the Crown may be in a readiness to march to oppose the Turks and Tartars, if they should endeavour to act Offensively against Poland; and as soon as the Deputies, which they have sent to the Czarowitz at Thorn, shall be return'd, if they have not a favourable Answer, they have resolv'd to publish their Orders against the Payment of any farther Contributions to the Muscovites. Some other Points, which requir'd further deliberation, are deferr'd till the Meeting of the next Diet, which is to be held in December. A Danish Frigate has taken a Swedish Pacquet-Boat, on board of which were a Colonel and Captain, who had Letters about them from the King of Sweden, bearing Date at Bender.

Gand, May 4. N. S. His Grace the Duke of Ormond, Captain General of the British Forces, arriv'd here Yesterday in the Evening, being Saluted with a Triple Discharge of our Cannon. His Grace has receiv'd the Compliments of divers Persons of Distinction, and of our Magistrates, who this Day entertain'd him in their Council House. There is not any time as yet fix'd for his Departure from this Place. We have Advice from the Camp of the Allies, that the Hereditary Prince of Hesse Cassel had detach'd Forty Battalions, with Twenty Pieces of Cannon, under the Command of General Fagel, who pass'd the Scheld by divers Bridges below Bouchain, and that they had Entrench'd themselves upon the Heighth of Hordain, and Lieu St. Amand. They were sustain'd

And by a Body of four hundred Horse, under the Command of the Duke of Wirtemberg, the Prince of Hesse Cassel being likewise there, with several other Generals; so that they are now in a Condition to hinder any Attempts which the Enemy may make for passing the Scheld, or approaching near to Bouchain. General Hompesch march'd at the same time with a strong Detachment from the Garrison of Doway, together with four Pieces of Cannon, and a great number of Pioneers, towards the Canal of Arleux, where they are now at work in opening the Canal; so that the Waters from the Senlet may have their ordinary Course into the Canal of Doway. Both these Enterprizes had their Success, without any Motion on the part of the Enemy, to endeavour to obstruct them.

Utrecht, May 6. N. S. The Ministers of France having not receiv'd Instructions from their Court, for giving an Answer in Writing to the Demands of the Allies, no General Conference was held on Wednesday the Fourth Instant; nor are we yet assur'd, that they will be prepar'd against to Morrow on that Occasion. Yesterday Morning the Ministers of the Allies met at the Town-house; those of the States-General having before desir'd a Conference with the Lord Privy-Seal and the Earl of Strafford, at which the former, being indispos'd, did not assist: In the Afternoon the same Ministers desiring another Conference with their Lordships, met at the Lord Privy-Seal's House, where they continu'd some Hours together; after which four of the said Ministers set out for the Hague, from whence they are expected to return with fresh, and more ample Instructions. In the Evening Baron Bothmar, Plenipotentiary from the Elector of Hanover and Brunswick, likewise went to the Hague, accompany'd by Monsieur Newbourg, Counsellor and Secretary to his Electoral Highness. Sir Robert Brown, Major-General in the Service of King Augustus, some Days since arriv'd at this Place.

Yarmouth, April 28. On the Twenty sixth, and Yesterday, pass'd through this Road a Fleet of laden Colliers to the Southward.

Falmouth, April 26. Come in from Cruising Sir Thomas Hardy in the Kent, with the Berwick and Romney, having taken a French Prize bound for Newfoundland.

Bristol, April 28. This Day sail'd Her Majesty's Ship the Hastings, and under her Convoy, the Foy Frigat, Diamond and Beauford Gallies, for Cork and Jamaica; the Queen Anne for Gibraltar, and the John and Mordicai of and for Barbadoes.
