Milan, May 1. N.S.

N the Eighth Instant, a Courier arriv'd here from General Zumjungen, who commands at the Siege of Porto Ercole with advice, that the Place, with the feveral Forts depending on it, capitulated on the Fifth, and that the Gar-rifons were to be transmitted to Toulon or Marfeilles at their own Expence.

Hanover, May 20. N. S. Yefterday his Electoral Highnefs, with the Court, went to pafs the Sum-mer at Herenhaufen, but the Electoral Prince and Princess still continue here. The same Day Mon-fieur de la Verne, and two of his Domesticks, were deliver'd to a Major and two other Officers, who had been fent thither by the Emperor, and they all fet out immediately for Vienna, under the Guard of a Party of Dragoons. We have advice here, that his Czarısh Majesty has caus'd Twenty thoufand Muscovites to march into Pomerania, and that the King of Pruffia has agreed to their Paffage thorough his Dominions, provided they obfervid a ftrict Discipline, and pay for every thing they have occasion for. This Body of Muscovites is to join another which is already in Pomerania, and both are to be commanded by Prince Menzikoff, under the Czarowitz, who at prefent refides at Thorn 7 but upon the opening of the Campaign will be at the Head of the Army. Here are divers Letters from Conftantinople which import, that the Sultan ha-ving, by an Effendi, fent to the Cham of the Tar-tars, and defir'd to know his Thoughts in relation to a Rupture with the Czar, the Cham had return'd an Anfwer, That fince the Czar had reftored Afoph, purfuant to the Treaty, in his Opinion, the Peace ought to be maintain'd; upon which, the Sultan had caus'd it to be published in all the Mosques, that the Peace with the Muscovites was continu'd. These Letters add, that the King of Sweden will have a Guard of Four thousand Men to conduct him thorough Poland to his own Dominions. They write from Drefden, that King Augustus went from thence on the Twelfth Initant to the Baths of Carelibad in Bohemia, being accompanied by the Prince of Furftemberg, and attended by feveral of his Mi-niflers and Privy Council, and that the reft of the Court were preparing to follow him. The common report is, that the Czar of Mufcovy is to have an interview with the King of Poland at that Place, where it is faid the King of Denmark will likewife meet them, to conful a begin for the Operations meet them, to confult Mucasures for the Operations

From the Camp at Marchiennes, May 25. N. S. Upon the Twenty third of this Instant his Grace the Duke of Ormond reviewed the Right Wing of the first Line of his Army, which confisted of all the British Troops now in the Camp, and Sixteen Squadrons of Dragoons of the Auxiliary Troops in Her Majesty's Fay. They all made a very fine Ap-pearance, and after the Review was over, his Grace entertain'd Prince Eugene and the General Officers of both Armies at Dinner. Yesterday his Guace the Duke of Ormond was at Bouchain, to vifit the Fortifications of the Place, and likewife the Camp of the Allies under the Command of General Fagel, on the other fide the Schelde. A Disposition is making for the two Armies to pass that River to Morrow, and in order to preferve a Communication with our Places lying on the Scarpe, our Troops for fome Days pais'd have been at work in repair-ing the old French Lines between Denain and Waler, and drawing another parallel to it from our Bridges to Beaurepiere, in both which there will be posted such a number of Forces as may fecure our Convoys of Provisions, as well from the Enemies Garrifons at Valenciennes and Conde, as from their Amry.

Utrecht, May 24. N. S. On Saturday the Twen-ty first Instant a Messenger arrived here from Great Britain. The next Morning the Earl of Strafford fet out very early for England. Yesterday Count Corlana, fecond Plenipotentiary from his Imperial Majefty, and Monfieur Englebrecht, on the part of the Circle of the Upper-Rhine, produced their full Powers at a Conference held as usual between the Ministers of the Allies at the Town-House, and the above-named Plenipotentiaries were admitted ac-cordingly. In the Afternoon Monfieur Marshall de Beiberitein, one of the Plenipotentiaries of the King of Prussia, return'd hither from Amsterdam. Three of the Plenipotentiaries of the States-General, Mon-fieur Vander-Duffen, Monfieur Moermont, and Count Rechteren, are gone for a few Days to the. Hague.
