*Genoa, May 14. N. S.*

**N**INE Vessels belonging to this Republick arrived here Yesterday, in Twenty three Days from Barcelona, and in Ten from Port Mahon. They came with an English and Dutch Fleet which are arriv'd at Vado. The Imperial Recruits are march'd to Final, which will be follow'd by other Troops, as well as those which were employ'd in the reduction of Fort of Philippo and Porto Ercole, and will embark there with all expedition for Barcelona.

*Venice, May 20. N. S.* They write from Rome, that the Pope had received the Resolutions of his Imperial Majesty, that he will not suffer his Ambassador to give Place to the Governor of Rome, nor that the Mail, with Letters from Vienna, should be sent to the Custom-house to be opened, and he has forbid the Pope's Nuncio to mention the Pretensions of any such Proceedings any more to him for the future. The Pope has summoned the Italian Cardinals to appear at the Canonization of the new Saints, which he designs to make in the Church of St. Peter's. The Cardinal della Santa Croce died upon the Twelfth Instant, by which there is now an Eighteenth Place become vacant in the College of Cardinals. We have received Advice from several Parts, that the Peace between the Ottoman Port and his Czarish Majesty is confirmed, and that a Turkish Commissary was sent to Bender, and the Muscovite Hostages had permission to depart from Constantinople. This Republick continues under no apprehensions of a Rupture with the Ottoman Port: However, to supply their Garrisons in the Morea, on Tuesday last the Regiment of Rossi pass'd the review at the Lido, and is preparing to embark on board the new Convoy designed for the Levant. The Fair of the Ascension, at which there has been a great Appearance of Persons of Distinction, will end to morrow. The Earl of Peterborough will be upon his departure from hence very speedily.

*Vienna, May 21. N. S.* Upon Wednesday last his Imperial Majesty departed from this Place for Hungary with a numerous Train of the Nobility, and lay the same Night at a Castle nam'd Petronel, belonging to Count Traun, Marechal of the Lower Austria: Being arrived at Woolfsall upon the Frontiers, he was receiv'd by some Deputies of the States, and at some distance was met by the whole Body, and mounting on Horseback, pass'd the Danube on a Bridge of Boats, and made his publick Entrance into Presburg about Three in the Afternoon, under a triple Discharge of the Cannon, and with all other dutiful and usual Solemnities by the Magistrates and Inhabitants. The next Day his Majesty came to the General Diet of the States of Hungary, and being seated on the Throne in the Royal Robes of that Kingdom, with great Solemnity, he made them the accustomed Propositions, which were answered with all Respect and Duty.

*Hamburg, May 31. N. S.* The Letters from Poland import, that among other Articles between the Czar and the Ottoman Port, it is agreed, That his Czarish Majesty shall withdraw his Troops from the Kingdom of Poland, as likewise from the Ukraï, and all the Provinces which depend upon it; and that the Polish Ukraï, shall continue in its former State, without any Damage hereafter to be done, to the Places or Inhabitants; and that the Muscoviaes shall evacuate Bialaczerkiow, and all the other Fortresses in which they now have Garrisons, and restore them to the Crown of Poland. The Danish Troops which had their Winter Quarters in Holstein, have received Orders to begin their March upon the Twentieth of the next Month, and as they give out, they will pass thorough the Duchy of Mecklenburg to open the Campaign with the Siege of Wismar, whilst Prince Menzikoff is to undertake that of Stetin with the Muscovite and Saxon Forces; and that the afore-mention'd Prince, has sent a Message by one of his Aides de Camp to King Augustus, to press him, pursuant to his Treaties with the Northern Confederates, to furnish him speedily with such Artillery as is necessary for the latter of these Expeditions.

*From the Camp at Solmes, June 1. N. S.* On Monday last Lieutenant-General Cadogan was sent out by his Grace the Duke of Ormond, with Seven hundred Horse and One thousand Hussars, to view the Ground about Landrecy and Quesnoy, and having advice upon his return, that Two hundred of the Enemies Foot were posted in a Wood, he dismounted part of his Men, who Attack'd the Enemy, killed Twenty of them, and took Forty Prisoners, with two Lieutenants, and the Captain who Commanded them. Seventy of the Enemies Hussars came Yesterday Morning to the Left of our Horse, and One hundred of our Men being out at the same time, fell upon the Enemy, killed Five and twenty of them, and brought in the rest, with their Officers, Prisoners, together with all their Horses.

*From the Camp at Solmes, June 4. N. S.* The Right Wing of the Horse and Foot of our Army being commanded Yesterday by his Grace the Duke of Ormond, made a Forage in the Front, between Chateau Cambresis, and Buffigny, with a Guard of Five hundred Horse and Three hundred Foot commanded by the Marquis of Harwich, and the Body returned without any Loss in the Evening. This Day the Left Wing of our Horse were commanded to Forage between Buffigny and Marrais, which is nearer to the Source of the Schelde. The Squadrons of the Enemy which were sent to the Source of the Schelde, are now returned to their Camp, and the Confederate Armies on both sides continue in their former Situation.

*Falmouth, May 14. Yesterday* Sail'd the Resolution Packet-Boat, Capt. Hales Commander, with two Mails, and an Express from Lisbon; as also the Hallifield-Gally, with Fish, &c. for Leghorn. Her Majesty's

Majesty's Ship the Hound, came in here from Mountsbay for Plymouth, to Victual.

*Deal, May 27.* Here are Her Majesty's Ships the Dreadnought, Sunderland, Le Moor, Rye, and the Pearl. Yesterday in the Afternoon came in hither Her Majesty's Ships the Guernsey and the Nonsuch, with about Forty Sail of Merchant Ships, and Coasters, all last from Portsmouth.
