ROAD TRAFFIC ACTS

NORWICH CITY COUNCIL

*City of Norwich, Road Closures—Spencer Street and
Branford Road*

Notice is hereby given that Norwich City Council proposes to make permanent the experimental closures of the above named roads. The details are as follows:

Spencer Street

Spencer Street would be closed at its junction with Bull Close Road

Branford Road

Branford Road would be closed at its junction with Sprowston Road

These two closures are required to improve the amenity of the area through which the roads run and would be brought into force by a Traffic Regulation Order known as "The City of Norwich (Spencer Street and Branford Road) (Prohibition of Driving) Order 1985". There will be an exemption for cyclists at both closures.

A copy of the draft Order, together with a map, may be examined at my offices at City Hall, during normal office hours. Telephone enquiries may be made to Norwich 622233, etc. 343 or 459.

Procedures are currently being carried out to introduce speed reducing humps in Spencer Street and when these are complete, it is proposed that the Order closing Spencer Street and Branford Road will be revoked.

If you wish to object to the proposals, you should send me your reasons in writing by not later than Wednesday, 19th June 1985.

BASILDON DISTRICT COUNCIL

*The District of Basildon (Fodderwick, Basildon) (Restriction
of Waiting) Order 1985*

Notice is hereby given that the District Council of Basildon, pursuant to arrangements made with the County Council of Essex under section 101 of the Local Government Act 1972 and in exercise of the powers of the said County Council under sections 1(1) and (2), 2(1) to (3) and 4(2) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 and Part III of Schedule 9 to that Act made on 23rd May 1985 a Traffic Order as follows:

To restrict waiting in the layby on the west of Fodderwick to use by disabled person's vehicles only between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. Mondays to Saturdays, limited to 2 hours.

A copy of the Order, together with a plan relating to the Order, may be examined at this office between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5.15 p.m., Mondays to Fridays.

If you wish to question the validity of the Order or of any provision contained in it on the grounds that it is not within the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 or on the grounds that any requirement of that Act or any instrument made under it have not been complied with in relation to the Order, you may within 6 weeks from 23rd May 1985 apply to the High Court for this purpose.

This Order came into operation on 28th May 1985.

*The Northamptonshire County Council (Arnold Road,
Northampton) (One-Way Traffic) Order 1985*
