Florence, May 24. N. S.

ON Sunday last General Zumjungen arrived here, and was immediately admitted to an Audience of the Great Duke; after having staid in Town four Hours he returned to his Troops, which were encamped near Pisa, with a Design to march thence the next Morning. They intended to be at Massa as this Day; according to the Route appointed them by the Emperor, they were to be at Milan upon the twentieth of this Month; but it is thought, by reason of several Difficulties they are likely to meet with in their March, it will take up a longer time. On Tuesday the Seventeenth Instant Admiral Jennings with the Fleet under his Command arrived at Leghorn, in order to take in Provisions for the Navy. In his way hither he informed himself at Vado, in what readiness the German Troops were for their Embarking, and he intends to sail within a few Days for that Place to take in the Foot, the Horse being to go by another Opportunity. Immediately after that Admiral was arrived here, he dispatch'd several Messengers of War to Cruise off the Isles of Hieres, and the Channel of Malta. Mr. Molesworth, Her Majesty's Envoy, is gone down to Leghorn, to settle some Affairs relating to the Fleet.

Venice, May 27. N. S. They write from Rome, that on the Fourteenth Instant, the Cardinal de la Tremouille wrote several Letters to the Cardinal Albani, and other of the Pope's chief Ministers, concerning the Promotion of Cardinals, which the King of France desir'd might be made: After which, in a secret Consistory, Eleven Cardinals were named, viz. the Bishop of Olmutz for the Emperor; the Bishop of Strasbourg for the Court of France; the Inquisitor General of Portugal for that Kingdom; Signior Rulli, Auditor of the Rota for the Republic of Venice; Signior Piazza, who is at present Nuncio at Vienna; Signior Davia, who was formerly Nuncio at the Imperial Court; Signior Cusani, who had been Nuncio in France; Signior Zandani heretofore Nuncio at Madrid; the Father Casiani a Russian Capuchin, and Preacher to the Pope's Court. Father Tolomei, a Jesuit, of Tuscany, Rector of the German College, who has undertaken to write the Continuation of Baronius's Annals; and Father Comati, a Theatin of Palermo, of the Family of the Dukes of Palma. On Saturday last a Consistory was held, wherein the Pope gave the Hats to the Cardinals Pruli, Cassini, Tolomei and Tolomei; and they appeared that Day in the Chappel. There are Seven Cardinals still remaining in Porto, whose Names the Pope keeps Secret, and therefore neither the Queen of Poland, nor the Marquis de Priore nor Monsieur Molinos, took notice of these Promotions by any signs of Publick rejoicing which were throughout the whole City, because the Cardinals for Spain and Portugal are not yet named. All the Family of the new Cardinal Knullovich who are here at Venice, had Publick Balls, Fireworks and Illuminations, for three Days and Nights together. The Earl of Peterborough went on Tuesday Night last for Vicenza, from whence he designs for Milan

and afterwards for Vienna. The Signior Sanudo has been excused by the Senate from going for Constantinople, as Bailo to this Republic, and Signior Dominico Tiepolo is appointed in his room. The Cavalier Stadell, being made Lieutenant-General of the Forces of this State, is preparing to go speedily to his Command in the Levant.

Milan, May 28. N. S. By Letters from Genoa of the 21st of this Month we are inform'd, that Sir John Jennings, with his Squadron, was gone to take in Provisions at Leghorn, but intended to return back to Vado before the 8th of the next Month, which is the Day appointed for the Embarking of the Troops design'd to be sent to Spain, consisting of Seven thousand Recruits for the Imperial Foot, about Seven hundred Troopers dismounted, and of Brigadier Dietrich's Regiment, making two Battalions of six hundred Men each. The Pope has declar'd Eleven Cardinals, and as they say here, has reserv'd Eight more in Petto.

Florence, May 31. N. S. Sir John Jennings with Her Majesty's Fleet sailed last Week from Leghorn toward Vado, in order to Convey the German Foot from thence to Catalonia.

Venice, June 3. N. S. We have Letters from Rome, which bring an Account of the Canonization of four new Saints, and that the Ceremony lasted about three Hours. The Lord Peterborough left Vicenza on Sunday last. The Cavalier Marini, who has resided here for the space of Twenty-two Years, with the Character of Envoy from Malta, died on Saturday Morning; his Body was buried with much Pomp in the Abby of St. John, which is a Commandry of the Order of Malta in this City. Signior Spinola, who was Nuncio to the King of Poland, is returned from thence, and is going through this Place for Rome, by the way of Padua. A Venetian Ship coming from Pago, as she passed by Zara, a Town in Dalmatia, met a Vessel belonging to that Port floating upon the Sea; the Master and four Seamen were found with their Throats cut, and all the Goods were Plundered: And it is supposed that this Fact was done by the Privateers of Dalmacio.

Utrecht, June 14. N. S. On Sunday the twelfth Instant the Lord Bishop of Bristol, in his Episcopal Robes, preached in the Church of St. John, and afterwards administered the Communion to as many of the English as were present there. Yesterday was held as usual a Conference amongst the Ministers of the Allies residing here, and in the Evening Count Sinzendorf, one of the Plenipotentiaries on the part of his Imperial Majesty, returned from the Hague to this Place. Mr. Harley is come back from Amsterdam, where he has been for a few Days. The Right Honourable the Lord Cornbury, who has resided here since the beginning of the Congress, designs very suddenly to go from hence, in order to embark for Great Britain. The Count Sinzendorf dispatch'd this Evening an Express for England, who is adviced from Switzerland, of the Surrender of Baden; and from Ratisbonne, of a Decree publish'd by the Emperor in the Diet there against the Protestant Captains engaged in the War.

Brussels, June 16. N. S. Here are Letters from the Camp of the Fifteenth Instant, but they bring no Account of the opening the Trenches before Quesnoy. The Garrison of that Place have made a vigorous Sally with Twelve hundred Men, which were beaten back into the Town, after an obstinate Resistance. Major General Grovstein on the Ninth Instant enter'd the Province of Champagne, with a Detachment of Eighteen hundred Horse, in order to lay that Country under Contribution, but we have not as yet received any Account of his return. Several Imperial and Palatine Troops are expected here from the Rhine:

Utrecht, June 17. Yesterday no Conference was held as usual between the Ministers of the Allies in the Town-house, pursuant to what they agreed on when they met last there. The Marquis Rinuccini, Plenipotentiary from the Great Duke of Tuscany, who has been for some Days at the Hague, is return'd from thence, and the Marquis du Bourg, one of the Plenipotentiaries from his Royal Highness the Duke of Savoy, is gone thither. The Right Honourable the Lord Cornbury receiv'd Visits Yesterday from many of the Ministers, and other Persons of distinction residing here; and this Day his Lordship, accompany'd out of Town by the Lord Privy Seal, went from hence in order to embark for Great Britain.

Hague, June, 17. N. S. On Wednesday Morning, being the Fifteenth of this Instant, the States-General held an extraordinary Assembly, which continued till Night. Yesterday Morning we had advice from the Army, that the Prince of Hanover arrived there upon the tenth of this Month. Messieurs Welderen and Hop, came to the Army upon the Eleventh Instant, and the same Day had a Conference with his Grace the Duke of Ormond. Upon the twelfth in the Afternoon the French made a Sally out of Quesnoy upon Two hundred Men of the Allies, and would have drove them from the Post which the latter had seized on, but the Prince of Hesse coming to their Assistance, the Enemy were obliged to retire into the Town. Capain de Tour, of the Guards of Orange belonging to the States, was killed in this Action. Major-General Grovstein is marched with a Body of Fourteen thousand Dragoons and Hussars of Prince Eugenes Army, to penetrate into the Province of Campaign, and they have advice in the Army, that he was already got beyond the Somme and the Oise; and that to avoid any manner of Danger from the Detachments of the French, which nevertheless he did not apprehend to be within Twenty four Hours of him, he would make his return through Germany by the way of Traerback. At the same time the Major-General had dispatch'd some Hussars towards Paris, in hopes of a Booty. The Deputies of the States held an extraordinary Assembly Yesterday, after which they sent away an Express to the Army.
