ANIMAL HEALTH ACT 1981

The Secretary of State for Wales, by this licence issued under Article 3 (2) of the Importation of Animals Order 1977, hereby authorises the landing in Great Britain, in accordance with the conditions set out below, of

This licence is valid for imports from 1st October 1985 until varied or revoked by the Secretary of State for Wales.

Licence No. WOAD/GEN/C/84 2 and Licence No. AHL 1/37/8 No. 7 are hereby revoked with effect from 1st October 1985.

Conditions

1. All landings of cattle shall be in accordance with the provisions of the Importation of Animals Order 1977 and with the following provisions of this licence.

2. On landing in Great Britain, the cattle shall immediately be taken to an approved reception centre linked with the port as specified below:

Port of Landing and Linked Reception Centre

Holyhead linked with Lairage No. 1, Kingsland, Holyhead or Bryn Eglwys, Llanfwrwg, Holyhead.

Fishguard linked with Duggans Field, Manorowen, Fishguard.

Cattle for Breeding or Meat Production

FOR OFFICIALLY BRUCELLOSIS FREE CATTLE

3.A. Each consignment of OBF cattle shall be accompanied by a certificate in accordance with Annex F, Model 1 of EEC Directive 64/432 (as amended), signed by a veterinary officer appointed by the Government of the Republic of Ireland.

B. Under Article 7(1)G, of EEC Directive 64/432 (as amended), by way of Derogation from Article 3 (3) (e), female animals of less than 30 months of age intended for meat production need not be tested for enzootic bovine leukosis. They shall be marked by means of a metal tag with a blue plastic disc, in the left ear.

FOR BRUCELLOSIS FREE CATTLE

4.A. Each consignment of BF cattle shall be accompanied by two certificates signed by a veterinary officer appointed by the Government of the Republic of Ireland:

(a) A certificate in accordance with Annex F, Model 1 of EEC Directive 64/432 (as amended), and

(b) A certificate stating the following:

(i) as far as can be determined and to the best of my knowledge and belief the female cattle to be exported have not been vaccinated against brucellosis;

(ii) the cattle were examined by a veterinary officer at the time of loading and showed no erupted permanent incisor teeth; and

(iii) a certificate has been received from an approved veterinary surgeon, that the female cattle are not pregnant.

B. Under Article 7 (1) G, of EEC Directive 64/432 (as amended), by way of Derogation from Article 3 (3) (e), female animals of less than 30 months of age intended for meat production need not be tested for enzootic bovine leukosis. They shall be marked by means of a metal tag, with a blue plastic disc, in the left ear.

Cattle for Slaughter

5. (a) Each consignment of cattle shall be accompanied by a certificate in accordance with Annex F, Model II of EEC Directive 64/432 (as amended).

(b) For cattle from herds of neither OBF nor BF status, the following condition will apply:

Female animals and bulls must have passed the serum agglutination test for brucellosis (at less than 30 ius) within 30 days of loading.

(c) Cattle for slaughter shall be licensed from the reception centre only to a slaughterhouse for immediate slaughter under the terms of a licence issued under Article 11 (5) of the Importation of Animals Order 1977.

6. The cattle in the categories described at paragraphs 5 (b) must be shipped direct from ROI to Great Britain.

General

7. Officially brucellosis free (OBF), brucellosis free (BF) cattle and non OBF/BF cattle must be kept separate from each other and must not come into contact with other animals not similarly certified. Failure to observe this requirement will result in all the animals being classified in the lowest status.

8. Any person wishing to land animals in Great Britain under the terms of this licence must make arrangements for accommodation of the animals in advance with the occupier of the reception centre to which the animals are to be taken after landing.
