TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING (TREE PRESERVATION ORDER)
REGULATIONS 1969 (AS AMENDED)*Ogwr Borough Council Tree Preservation Order (No. 15)
1985 (re : Queen Street, Tondy)*

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the Borough of Ogwr in pursuance of their powers as Local Planning Authority under section 60 of the Town and Country Planning Act 1971, on 6th December 1985, made a Tree Preservation Order in respect of trees in the vicinity of Queen Street, Tondy, in the County of Mid Glamorgan.

The said Order contains a direction under section 61 of the Act the effect of which is set out below in Note 1.

The grounds for making the said Order are that the trees provide an important amenity feature in the landscape both to local residents in the vicinity of Queen Street and to the general public over a wider area.

A certified copy of the Order and the map included therein may be inspected without charge at Room 303, Municipal Buildings, Queen Street, Bridgend, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. and between the hours of 2 p.m. and 4.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday.

Should you wish to raise any objections or make any representations with respect to the Order they should be made in accordance with Regulation 7 of the Town and Country Planning (Tree Preservation Order) Regulations 1969 (as amended) and information regarding these regulations is set out below in Note 2.

If no objection or representations are duly made, or if any so made are withdrawn, then not less than 42 days from the date of the service of this notice, the order may be confirmed (but without any modification) as an unopposed Order by the Ogwr Borough Council. Any objections or representations received, however will be considered, after which the Order may be confirmed by the Council with or without any modification.

NOTE 1

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1971

Section 61 (2) of the above Act provides that notwithstanding section 60 (4) of this Act, an Order which contains a direction under section 61 (1) of the Act shall take effect provisionally on such date as may be specified therein and shall continue in force by virtue of the said section 61 until:

- (a) the expiration of a period of 6 months beginning with the date on which the Order was made ; or
 - (b) the date on which the Order is confirmed ;
- whichever first occurs.

AMENDMENT REGULATION 1981*Objections and representation*

7.—(1) Every objection or representation with respect to an Order shall be made in writing to the Chief Executive Officer of the Ogwr Borough Council, Municipal Offices, Rhiw, Bridgend, and shall state the grounds thereof and specify the particular trees, group of trees, or woodlands in respect of which it is made.

(2) An objection or representation shall be duly made if it complies with paragraph (1) of this regulation and is received by the Chief Executive Officer of the Ogwr Borough Council within 28 days from the date of the service of the notice of the making of the Order.

- (1) *Clevedon Conservation Area (Direction No. 3)*
 - (2) *Clevedon (Triangle) Conservation Area (Direction No. 2)*
- Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State for the Environment in pursuance of the powers reserved to him by Article 4 of the Town and Country Planning General

Development Orders 1977 to 1983, has approved two Directions made thereunder by the District Planning Authority relating to certain buildings within the designated Conservation Areas for Clevedon.

The two Directions relate to development of the kind set out in the Schedule below.

The effect of the Directions is that the works set out in the Schedule hereto, which are those works to windows or fenestration, which affect the external appearance of the dwelling or other building within the curtilage of a single dwellinghouse cannot be undertaken without the prior approval of the District Planning Authority.

The Directions were confirmed by the Secretary of State on 15th November 1985.

Development of the kind specified below:

So much of the enlargement, improvement or other alteration, including replacement of frames, to the windows or fenestration of a dwellinghouse, porch or any building within the curtilage of such single dwellinghouse identified within the Clevedon Conservation Area and Clevedon (Triangle) Conservation Area, other than buildings of a temporary nature, or required only for a purpose incidental to the enjoyment of the dwellinghouse with the exception in paragraph 3 of Class I, being development comprised within paragraphs 1, 2 or 3 of Class I of the First Schedule to the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1977 as amended,

and not being development comprised within any other Class.

HIGHWAYS ACT 1980, SECTION 116

Notice of Intention to Stop-Up Highway

Notice is hereby given that the Mayor and Burgesses of the London Borough of Islington acting by the Council of the Borough (hereinafter called "the Council") being the Highway Authority in respect of the roads hereinafter mentioned and as such the appropriate authority within the meaning of section 116 of the Highways Act 1980 hereby give notice that on 13th January 1986 at 2 p.m. the said Council intend pursuant to the said section to make an application to the Highbury Corner Magistrates' Court sitting at 51 Holloway Road, London N.7, for an Order to authorise the stopping-up of part of the highway known as Fulbrook Mews, London N.19, in the said Borough on the ground that it is unnecessary. A plan showing the part of the highway to be closed may be inspected free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on weekdays (excluding Saturdays) in the Legal Department, Town Hall, Upper Street, London N1 2UD.

On the hearing of the said application any person to whom notice is given, any person who uses the said highway and any other person who would be aggrieved by the making of the Order for which application is to be made shall have a right to be heard.
