- (a) To make the existing residents' parking places avail-able exclusively for residents for the full 24 hours of every day. The parking places will therefore not be available for those vehicles not displaying a residents' parking permit in the evening or on Sunday, as they are at present.
- There are many competing demands for available roadside space in the Jericho Residents' parking zone, especially in the evenings. The introduction of 24-hour operation of residents' parking places is proposed in order to give residents a better opportunity to park within a reasonable distance of their homes at all times.
- (b) To remove the requirement for motorcycles parked in residents' parking places to display a permit and to park parallel to the kerb.

The present requirement for motorcycles to park parallel to the kerb can, in certain circumstances, need-lessly take up valuable road space. Sometimes, per-mits displayed on motorcycles have been removed and, as a result, motorcycles have received fixed penalty notices. The removal of these two requirements should prevent such problems in the future.

- (c) To vary the pattern of waiting and parking controls in Canal Street between Victor Street and Cranham Street to provide a net increase in residents' parking places and in increase in 3-hour parking places. This proposal is made in order to meet local demand.
- (d) The Order also incorporates all other existing traffic management measures in the residents' parking zone area into one Order in the interests of effective enforcement.
