Under the provisions of sections 61A and 102 of the 1971 Act, it is an offence for any person to cut down, top, lop, uproot, wilfully damage or wilfully destroy a tree (subject to certain exemptions) in the Conservation Area. Any persons desirous of carrying out works on trees should give the District Council at least 6 weeks notice prior to the intended works being undertaken. Failure by any person to comply with the provisions of sections 61A and 277A of the 1971 Act is a criminal offence for which they may be prosecuted, by the District Council.
